Slow Cooker Mongolian Beef

Ingredients

- 1 ½ pounds Flank Steak
- ¼ cups cornstarch
- 2 tablespoons Olive Oil
- ½ teaspoons mince Garlic, Cloves
- ¾ cups Soy Sauce
- 3/4 cups Water
- ¾ cups Brown Sugar
- 1 cup grated Carrots
- green onions, for garnish

Instructions

- 1. Cut flank steak into thin strips. In a ziplock bag add flank steak pieces and cornstarch. Shake to coat.
- 2. Add olive oil, minced garlic, soy sauce, water, brown sugar and carrots to slow cooker. Stir ingredients. Add coated flank steak and stir again until coated in the sauce.
- Cook on high 2-3 hours or on low 4-5 hours until cooked throughout and tender. Can serve over rice and garnish with green onions.

ReWilding Through Restoration



Become Familiar with

Wealth **Transfer Strategies**

To retire comfortably, you need to save and invest regularly using an effective savings and investment strategy. Maximizing RRSPs or other retirement accounts will likely be essential to realizing your retirement goals. Once you retire, you'll need to "switch gears" somewhat and begin considering wealth transfer strategies.

An effective wealth transfer strategy can help you accomplish a variety of goals, such as distributing your assets the way you choose, avoiding probate fees and reducing estate taxes. You can explore a variety of wealth transfer tools, including the following:

- Gifting Gifting your assets to your adult children can help minimize the size of your estate, reducing the tax burden at death. This could also potentially lower probate, executor and legal fees. Be careful when gifting property (including cash and securities) to a spouse or minor child, as income attribution rules may apply, causing income earned on the gifted property to be taxed in your hands.
- If you donate securities with a capital gain to a registered Canadian charity then there is no tax payable on the capital gain, and you get full credit for the donation, up to the standard charitable deduction limit.
- Will A will is simply a plan for distributing your assets to family members and other beneficiaries. If you were to die intestate (without a will), provincial laws would determine how your assets should be distributed and there's no guarantee that the end result would be what you would have chosen.
- · Beneficiary designations Many of your financial assets — including life insurance policies, RRSPs and

TFSAs — allow you to name a beneficiary. Upon your death, your beneficiary will automatically receive these assets, avoiding the sometimes time-consuming, expensive (and public) process of probate. It is essential that you periodically review these designations to make sure they reflect your current wishes and that they do not conflict with the terms of your will.

- Trusts Different trusts can help you accomplish a variety of wealth transfer and estate planning goals. For example, an inter vivos trust can help you leave assets to your heirs without going through probate. You can also structure the trust to stagger payments over a number of years, rather than all at once, or include other restrictions or incentives. A testamentary trust, created in your will, can allow your heirs to effectively income split with the trust, potentially decreasing overall taxation.
- As you can see, trusts are versatile instruments but they are also complex. Consequently, you'll need to consult with your tax and legal advisors regarding your particular situation.
- Permanent Life Insurance When building an estate for your heirs, you have typically considered both reqistered and unregistered investment accounts as your principal sources of accumulating wealth. Permanent life insurance can be used to effectively accumulate wealth and pass it along to children or grandchildren, typically in a very tax-efficient manner.
- All the wealth transfer techniques we've looked at will require some careful thought and preparation on your part — so don't wait too long before getting started. Time has a way of sneaking up on all of us — but it's especially sneaky when we're unprepared.



Front Yards in September

September is a most excellent time of year to observe your neighbours' front gardens as the success of their efforts is abundantly apparent. If you have spent any time walking along your community's sidewalks lately, you will have noticed who gardens in front of their home, and who does not. We have just come through the hottest, driest, most challenging summer in many decades. I have no statistics to support my statement, but I would venture a guess that 90% of my neighbours have given up watering their grass, relying upon Mother Nature to bring it back to life with autumn rains. The lush green lawns where owners have watered and watered this summer definitely stand out. But anyone can have lush green grass with timely fertilizing and regular (and expensive unless you are fortunate to not have a water meter) application of water.

The gardens that are most impressive, however, have gone way beyond grass. First of all, they all have full or almost full sun during the day, eliminating those who face north. Secondly, variety and colour that attracts the eye is abundant. Annual flowers such as petunias and geraniums are typical standbys because they demand little effort and bloom from spring until frost. The talented gardeners who keep to a budget have planted many different bulbs and perennials that bloom in turn throughout the growing season. This year, I have noticed more vegetables being grown in the sunny front yards, sometimes alone, sometimes mixed in with flowers and shrubs. What a delight! One family specializes in sunflowers of several heights and colours, bordered by potatoes - beauty and practicality. On another walk, I counted at least seven varieties of squash crawling over the narrow strip of lawn that borders the sidewalk (a nod to the cultural norm of the street) along with tomatoes heavy with fruit. All this is backed by colourful flowers both annual and perennial – a creative mix of vegetable and flower garden all on display to enchant the walking neighbour. (There is probably more in there, but I was doing my best to keep my feet on the sidewalk and not trespass.) We have in our community a few marvelous rock gardens which look as if they need minimal maintenance, a mistaken notion by some of the lawn people. Just stop weeding and primping for a few weeks and see how untidy things become. The truly minimal maintenance people have been inspired by the desert communities of the USA and turned their patch of land into gravel and rocks, sometimes punctuated with trees, junipers and other arid plants. Even these gardens add variety to our typical grass monoculture landscape.

In older communities such as mine, the trees are mature. They create a canopy and character to the street missing from newer neighbourhoods where front garages take precedence. It always is saddening to see a large tree come down, but heartening when a new one is planted. Giant spruce trees in front of your windows can make your house really dark; understandably they sometimes have to go. You may not have planted that particular tree, but if you take it out, you have the choice of what to put in its place. The savvy home-owner knows that a new baby tree will grow into a beautiful mature one in the future, enhancing your front garden and the enjoyment of your home, for you and future generations. In gardens, as in many things, one style does not fit all. Whether you favour gravel and stones, vegetables, flowers or grass, the bones of the garden are the trees and shrubs. Go for a walk and look around with new eyes. You may find inspiration for next year.





By now all of us have received our Green Bins from the City. I have been informed that the pilot project exceeded expectations. On a provincial level, many "green initiatives" have been ongoing for years. Some interesting facts regarding recycling in Alberta are below.

Conservative Party during the coming month!

- In 2016 Albertans returned over two billion beverage containers to depots for reuse/recycling – a return rate of 86.2 %.
- · Alberta Beverage Container Recycling Corporation (AB-CRC), is a non-profit, consumer funded program that the government does not contribute to, nor receive money from. The program is funded by: unredeemed deposit refunds and market value of recovered material. These do not cover all program costs and a voluntary container recycling fee (CRF), paid by consumers at point-of-purchase (e.g. the \$0.08 fee), and covers any remaining costs.
- The ABCRC regularly monitors and adjusts fees every February 1. Overall, program funding is used to cover the net costs to recover and process used beverage containers, and to ensure the overall sustainability of the beverage container recycling system.
- The electronics recycling program is currently adding 275 products over the next few months and so I would encourage you to call 1-888-999-8762, email electronics @albertarecycling.ca or check their website at www. albertarecycling.ca to find out all the products included.

To make sure Halloween is fun for the whole family, Calgary Humane Society wants to remind you of a few safety tips for your pets!

- 1. Keep candy out of reach of pets! Chocolate, artificial sweeteners and certain types of nuts are toxic to animals.
- 2. Set up a safe space! Setting up a room with your pet's favorite items in a quiet area of the house will help to block out some of the stressful aspects of the holiday.
- 3. Leave Fido at home. Including the family pet on trick or treating may seem like fun, but strange costumes and fast moving children could cause your pooch a lot of stress.
- 4. Put a sign on the door asking trick or treaters to knock. Many pets may react to the doorbell more than knocking.
- 5. Be cautious with your costume, especially if your pet is easily frightened. Consider setting your pet up in a safe space before getting changed into your festive duds.
- **6. Be careful with Fido's costume.** Keep dress-up sessions short and watch for signs that your pet is becoming annoyed with their costume. Most pets do not like costumes so if you must dress up your pet, consider snapping a few photos and removing the costume right away.
- 7. Do not allow your cats to roam. A popular myth is that cats can fall victim to foul play on Halloween. While we have not seen that occur in Calgary, roaming cats can fall victim to the increased traffic or may become lost if they are frightened by all the little ghouls and goblins collecting candy.
