Winter is here!

November brought the big snow! And we know it is here to stay. The snowfall in November caused a bit of an issue with sidewalks and, of course, snow removal. So again, here is a summary from the City of Calgary of our snow and ice bylaws.

Who you gonna call?

9-1-1

• Within 24 hours after the snow has been deposited, all snow and ice must be completely removed from City

pathways and sidewalks. *Please see below for definitions* of a sidewalk and pathway.

- Owners and occupants of a home are responsible for removing snow and ice from the pathways and sidewalks in the front or to the side of their property.
- All snow and ice must be removed down to the bare surface of the sidewalk or pathway.
- Snow and ice must be removed from a City pathway or sidewalk that runs parallel to or directly adjacent to a street, even if it is separated by a boulevard.
- If you own a rental property, you are ultimately responsible for ensuring the sidewalks and pathways are cleared.
- The owner or occupant of land adjacent to a sidewalk must remove all snow and ice. Those adjacent to a pathway must remove snow and ice for a minimum width of 1.5 meters from the side of the pathway closest to their property.

A **sidewalk** is that part of a street set aside specifically for pedestrian use.

A **pathway** is a multi-purpose thoroughfare used by pedestrians, cyclists and persons using wheeled conveyances such as skateboards.



Warning Notices

If you receive a Warning Notice for failure to remove snow and ice from a sidewalk or pathway and do not remove it within 24 hours, The City of Calgary workforce will be instructed to carry out the work and the cost will be invoiced to the property owner. Failure to pay this will result in the cost being added to the property taxes.

Snow & Ice helpful hints

Tips that will help make clearing your sidewalk a little easier:

- A free sand/salt mixture, called pickle, is available for pick up at most fire halls and Roads depots. This mixture helps to break down built-up snow and ice on your sidewalk, so it can be fully removed down to the bare surface. Please note, during periods of heavy snowfall, this mixture is in high demand and fire halls may have to wait for the mixture to be restocked.

 - This mixture falls under the City of Calgary's Road Salt Management Plan. It adheres to Environment Canada's Code of Practice for the Environmental Management of Road Salts.

Drive with care, slow down and be aware:

The clock has been turned back and winter is just around the corner, the mornings and evenings are darker. Please take your time as you drive through the community, be on the lookout for folks walking through the community, whether it's families playing in the parks, waiting/getting of the bus, folks going to/from the bus, or someone walking a pet, our community is an active one. A reminder, the speed limit for residential areas is 50km - that includes Walden Blvd. Put your cell phones away, Pay attention to your surroundings. Let's keep our community safe and ourselves safe!

Crime of Opportunity | Prevention efforts – A message from our CPS Officers

As you know our local officers continue to conduct crime prevention checks in Walden and communities throughout Calgary.

In November, CPS officers started to keep a look out for vehicle theft opportunities such as vehicles unlocked and running with keys inside. This provides an opportunity to educate property owners and to prevent car thieves from stealing these very vehicles. Often criminals will travel around communities in groups looking for unattended running vehicles to steal. The person at fault is always the offender who chooses to commit the crime but we hope through crime prevention education to dramatically reduce opportunities for these thieves.

- Between 06:30 hours and 08:30 hours Monday November 13, local patrol members located 24 vehicles unlocked and running with keys inside. Considering the morning temperature was only -5, this was a large number of vehicles checked by district 8 CPS members.
- One house in particular was very concerning, vehicle running unlocked inside the attached garage with the garage door partly open. This poses a huge safety issue for potential CO2 poisoning.
- Between 06:00 hours and 08:30 hours Tuesday November 14, local police members located 28 vehicles unlocked and running with keys in the ignition.

Please help us prevent as many auto thefts as possible by:

- Never leaving a running vehicle unattended. If your keys must be in the ignition to warm it up, please remain with your vehicle.
- Installing a remote starter if possible, however, always make sure the vehicle is locked.
- Using a steering wheel lock to deter thieves.
- Never leaving children unattended in a running vehicle.
- Never leaving spare keys or garage door openers in or around your vehicle. If a garage door opener goes missing at any time, the garage door should be immediately recorded.
- If your keys are stolen, immediately changing the locks for the keys that have gone missing, including residences and vehicles.
- Always locking the man door leading from a garage into a residence.
