

Halloween hazards! Keeping your Pet Safe

Happy October!

It's hard to believe but Halloween is just around the corner! Soon the streets will be flooded with little ghouls and goblins looking to fill bags full of sweet treats. Halloween is a great opportunity to meet your neighbours, admire some creative costumes and, of course, enjoy the occasional mini chocolate bar!

While Halloween is a fun time for people, it can be a scary time for pets! The strange visitors, ringing doorbell and unusual costumes may cause stress or even frighten a family pet. Just as families must take safety precautions to ensure a safe and happy Halloween for children, pet owners should be mindful of safety during the festivities. To make sure Halloween is fun for the whole family, Calgary Humane Society wants to remind you of a few safety tips for your pets!

- Keep candy out of reach of pets! Chocolate, artificial sweeteners and certain types of nuts are toxic to animals.
- Set up a safe space! Setting up a room with your pet's favorite items in a quiet area of the house will help to block out some of the stressful aspects of the holiday.
- Leave Fido at home. Including the family pet on trick or treating may seem like fun, but strange costumes and fast moving children could cause your pooch a lot of stress.
- 4. Put a sign on the door asking trick or treaters to knock, especially if your pet reacts to the doorbell!
- Be cautious with your costume, especially if your pet is easily frightened. Consider setting your pet up in a safe space before getting changed into your festive duds.
- 6. If your pet is dressing up, choose a costume that does not restrict your pet's airway or movement. Keep dress-up sessions short and watch for signs that your pet is becoming annoyed with their costume. Most pets do not like costumes so if you must dress up your pet, consider snapping a few photos and removing the costume right away.

- 7. Do not allow your cats to roam. A popular myth is that cats can fall victim to foul play on Halloween. While we have not seen that occur in Calgary, roaming cats can fall victim to the increased traffic or may become lost if they are frightened by all the little ghouls and goblins collecting candy.

Halloween Safety

The members of Calgary's Halloween Partners for Safety: Calgary's Child Magazine, EMS, Calgary Police, Fire, 9-1-1, Bylaw, Transit, and Shaw Communications would like to remind parents and trick-or-treaters of some Halloween safety tips, as October 31st approaches. Partners for Safety vehicles will be out patrolling communities on Halloween night to provide a visible safety resource for parents and trick-or-treaters.

Trick-or-Treaters

- Remember: all regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks, or well-lit corners only. It is safest to work your way up one side of the street, and then cross once to the other side.
- · Stay away from houses that are not well lit. Do not accept rides from strangers, or enter any home you feel is unsafe.
- Let your parents know where you are going to be at all times (route) and advise them if you will be late returning.

Costumes

- All costume accessories, such as sticks, rods, or wands, should be soft and flexible, with no sharp edges.
- · Consider using hypoallergenic make-up kits instead of masks that may impair breathing, or vision.
- Be sure costumes are loose enough to be worn over warm clothing, but not so long that they become a tripping hazard. Costumes should not be longer than your child's ankles.
- Ensure your child is wearing adequate foot wear that takes into consideration weather conditions and walking.
- · Consider sending your children with a flashlight for additional safety and increased visibility.
- When purchasing, or making costumes, look for materials and accessories that are labeled flame-resistant.
- Choose bright colored costumes that are highly visible. Adding reflective tape to costumes further increases visibility.

- Be certain that young trick-or-treaters are accompanied by an adult. Older children should stay in groups.
- Advise children not to eat anything until they return home. Dispose of any items that appear to have been tampered with, or that are not properly wrapped.
- · Pre-determine boundaries to trick-or-treat within and establish a firm time to return home.

October is a time to reflect with gratitude on the people and good in our life. This October I have much to be thankful for, family, friends, and a love of serving the people and province of Alberta.

Legislative Session will be starting at the end of October and I expect some lively debate! When we are not in session, the business of the Legislature of Alberta still goes on. Committees have met throughout the summer and will continue to do so through the fall. There are currently 10 committees for the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, which comprise of standing committees, special committees, and legislative policy committees. I hold a position on both the Standing Committee on Alberta's Economic Future and Standing Committee on Public Accounts. The mandate of the Standing Committee on Alberta's Economic Future relates to the areas of Agriculture and Forestry, Advanced Education, Infrastructure, Economic Development and Trade, Culture and Tourism, and Labour. The Standing Committee for Public Account's mandate is to review the reports of the Auditor General of Alberta and the public accounts of the province. It is an honour to serve on both of these committees and represent not just the constituents of Calgary-Fish Creek but the interests of Albertans at this critical time of financial instability.

Currently two of the Standing Committees are inviting public input to review two pieces of legislation: Child and Youth Advocate Act and the Lobbyists Act. The Child and Youth Advocates responsibility is to represent the rights and interests of youth and children who are involved in the youth justice system or who are receiving interventional services. As the role of the Lobbyist has evolved, a review of the act is an opportunity to ensure the legislation is more current with new mediums of communication and connecting with politicians. I would encourage you all to visit the assembly website www.assembly.ab.ca to access both of these surveys.

It was a pleasure for the office to be represented at Andrew Sibbald School's new playground opening. It is a beautiful new playground and will be well used by the school and community for generations to come. I commend their efforts to enhance the children's school experience as well as benefitting the community. The parent group at Andrew Sibbald was able to access Alberta grants available to not-for profit community groups through Alberta Culture. Since 1998 Community Initiatives Program (CIP) and Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP) has distributed more than 1.1 Billion to not-for profit community groups across Alberta. The funding for CIP/CFEP grants are unique as the money does not come from general revenue/taxes but is sourced through lottery revenues.

Water Fluoridation in The City of Calgary

Over the past many months since the research study on "Measuring the Short-Term Impact of Fluoridation Cessation on Dental Caries in Grade 2 Children" was released by lead author and Albertan, Dr. Lindsay McLaren, I have been meeting frequently with Councillors Demong and Pootmans to consider not only the findings, but to determine what an objective go-forward plan could be for Calgary City Council to consider.

An important aspect of our meetings has included seeking professional expertise and advice from the University of Calgary's O'Brien Institute for Public Health (OIPH) and from Dr. Richard Musto, MD, FRCPC - Medical Officer of Health - Calgary Zone - Alberta Health Services. While Dr. Musto is certainly an advocate for fluoridation, that is contrasted by Dr. William Ghali, the Scientific Director of the OIPH who approaches matters such as this from a purely scientific non-advocacy perspective.

It is because of these conversations and advice, that we have developed the approach outlined in our Notice of Motion (presented to Council on September 12th). The Institute has established deep engagement and longitudinal partnerships with governments, health systems, and public health agencies that shape policies that influence our health. The OIPH is a credible agency to undertake this work. I would like to continue hearing from you on all pros and cons of this debate to use in our evaluation and research process. 0% Property Tax Increase

For weeks prior to the Strategic Meeting of Councilon June 27th, I asked what it would look like if property taxes were not raised to the proposed 4.7 percent (through ActionPlan), and instead, somewhere between zero and 3.2 percent.

On June 11th I held my Mobile Town Hall to help me get a better understanding of the needs of my constituents. The event gave me a forum to hear your concerns and your feedback helped to open my eyes to the needs of our Ward.

With the notion of a zero percent tax increase, services would have to be re-examined, adjusted, and possibly even cut. After speaking with my constituents, as well as my fellow Calgarians outside of Ward 13, I'm seeing more and more of an understanding that to see some sort of tax relief, it would mean a less strict quality of service target for City services. Although answers to which services citizens would lessen or cut altogether is a different story. That's the million dollar question.

When City Council approved the Four-Year Budget in 2014, financially, it was a much more optimistic and different time. Our City's economic outlook was prosperous. Much has changed and we need to change with them. In our current financial situation, City Council approved a vote to utilize the City's Fiscal Stability Reserve Fund, to be used in times of need.

With the economic downturn felt in our City, we as your elected officials need to make decisions that help to not only sustain us but to ensure prosperity in the future, while also giving credit to Administration in finding efficiencies that have already saved our City tens of millions of dollars.




