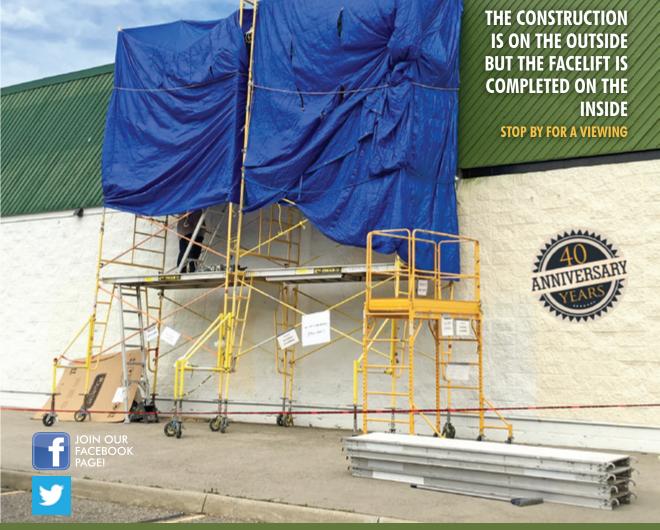

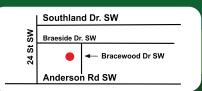

by, we have many seasoned players willing to teach the sport.

We have had a recent flurry of inquiries and reaching out to us to have the hockey rink up this year - those interested call the Centre.

I read through the 2016 ParticipACTion Report Card on Physical Activity for Children and Youth. The report paints a troubling picture of how our children are spending their time and the effect this is having on their sleep and ability to perform well in other areas of their lives.

Only 9% of Canadian Kids aged 5 to 17 get the 60 minutes of heart pumping activity they need each day.

Only 24% of 5 to 17-year-olds meet the Canadian Sedentary Behavior Guidelines recommendation of no more than 2 hours of recreational screen time per day.

Every hour kids spend in sedentary activities delays their bedtime by 3 minutes, and the average 5 to 17-year-old Canadian spends 8.5 hours being sedentary each day.

High school students in Canada spend an average of 8.2 hours in screen based sedentary behaviour.

Let's get our kids active and involved.

Many of our regular programs have restarted their season so check out our calendar and website or call the office for information. The Centre also brings many celebrations, weddings, birthdays, parties of all kinds. We offer some beautiful renovated spaces for rent; please call the Centre office to book a tour, we would love to have you.

Community memberships are still available for our 2016/2017 membership year. Our members have found the heart and soul of Cedarbrae. Meeting new friends, learning new skills, getting involved in community decision making, and having a real impact on the lives of others. Membership applications can be completed and dropped off at the Centre.

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# **HARVEST 2016 RECIPES**

Well the time has come for our annual harvest. Since our gardening season in Calgary consists of only 112 days, we have to make the best of it. With fall approaching we must be very mindful of the guick changes of weather; one overnight frost can take your hard labour and turn it into mush. I strongly suggest having poly (plastic) on hand in order to cover your beds for any last minute frost warnings. This may entitle you to an extra two to three weeks of growing season.

Root vegetables have the advantage of the soil to protect them from the frost. For example, beets, potatoes, turnips, carrots have the opportunity to get a little extra arowth.

# Ensuring root vegetables last through the fall and

- Potatoes and all root vegetables once they have been harvested should be set to dry on newspaper with the soil left on them. This will help the vegetables last much longer. Place them in a cardboard box in a dry cool area. Basement usually works well.
- · Canning is another great option, for example pickled beets with onions, canned potatoes, butternut squash soup freezes well, zucchini bread freezes up nicely.

# Suggestions for canning regular vegetables

- Beans & Carrots: Pickled for Caesar's
- Onions: Sliced or cut into small pieces freezes well for French Onion soup also pickles well with carrots
- Kale: Great in a smoothie, also makes wonderful chips in a dehydrator
- · Cabbage: although this takes up a great portion of your garden plot it is a wonderful vegetable to freeze whole. When defrosted the leaves are very soft and are great to use in the making of cabbage rolls.
- · Beets & Potatoes: sliced with Epicures Mandolin Slicer, put on the Epicure Chipster, and placed in a microwave



for homemade chips, sprinkled with Red Pepper Sansel seasoning makes for a great homemade snack.

Kale or Spinach: Par boil in boiling water with 1tsp of sea salt for approx. 30 seconds, remove from boiling water submerge into ice water bath to cool quickly remove and form into a ball, squeezing all excess water. Place on saran wrap and pack tightly. This freezes very well, keeps the color vibrant, use in breads, soup broth, and can substitute for spinach in spinach dip.

Par boiling Beans & carrots process in an ice baths and vacuum sealing then store in freezer for up to six months will ensure freshness.

Beets: Pickling is a great way to enjoy you garden all winter. My favorite is as follows:

- 3 Lbs small whole beets
- 1-cup white vinegar
- 1-cup apple cider vinegar
- 1-cup water
- ½-cup sugar
- 1tsp whole allspice
- 3 whole cinnamon sticks, or can be substituted for 1/2tsp nutmeg

You will notice continued work in our ward in preparation for the Southwest Calgary Ring Road (SWCRR). The City began work on SWCRR-related projects in late 2016. Each City project has its own timeline over the next four years, and the project teams will be updating and talking to residents throughout the different design and construction phases. The goal is to complete this work before fall 2021, when the Government of Alberta is scheduled to open the SWCRR.

Here's an update on The City projects and timelines that will affect us in Ward 11:

- 90th Avenue SW and Southland Drive connections
- Design: 2016 2017
- Construction: 2018
- Anderson Road widening, between SWCRR and Elbow Drive
- Design: 2016 2017
- Construction: 2017 2018
- · Glenmore Trail widening and changes to the Glenmore / Crowchild interchange
- Design: 2017
- Construction: 2018 2019

As the designs progress throughout 2016 and 2017, more information will be confirmed and available to the community. 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## Dear Constituents:

As we enter autumn, I continue to enjoy meeting constituents and attending community and stakeholder events. Also, I'm working hard on the Standing Committee for Resource Stewardship and the Economic Development Policy Committee; while reviewing bills and motions that best serve Albertans for session on October 31, 2016.

Some important initiatives the Government of Alberta is taking to benefit Albertans:

**Pipelines:** Premier Notley and the Ministers have had positive discussions with Canadian leaders about the importance of pipelines with success. Every government in Canada is committed to the view that developing energy infrastructure like pipelines is urgent to addressing our nation's economic situation. Pipelines are the safest way to transport Alberta's oil, benefitting all Canadians through jobs and a strong economy.

**Tools for Albertans:** Alberta Works offers a wide range of career and employment services to assist Albertans, whether making career transitions or looking for employment. For more information, visit http://www.humanservices.alberta.ca/financial-support/3171.html.

**Minimum Wage:** The \$15 hourly minimum wage will be phased in by 2018, which means there will be fewer families visiting the foodbank to make ends meet. Nearly, 300,000 Albertans will get closer to a living wage. The government has taken steps for a smoother transition through the current economic climate and increased minimum wage through:

- Reducing small business corporate income tax rate from 3 per cent to 2 per cent.
- Reintroducing the Summer Temporary Employment Program (STEP) to give youth an opportunity to gain valuable skills and employers work for reduced minimum wages.

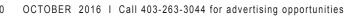
- Creating the Alberta Investor Tax Credit that encourages investment in small and medium-sized businesses in non-traditional sectors.
- Creating the Capital Investment Tax Credit that encourages businesses to invest in machinery, equipment and buildings to grow their business and create jobs.
- Continuing support of economic diversification and lending to small- and medium-sized businesses through a \$1.5 billion program with Alberta Treasury Branches.
- Increasing Alberta Child Benefit up to \$2,750 per year for the most vulnerable families
- Enhancing the Alberta Family Employment Tax Credit allowing more families to receive the credit or receive a larger credit.

**Infrastructure Investment:** The government's funding commitments include \$900 million in affordable housing and \$365 million to expand long-term care, which means more than 2,000 long-term care beds for seniors throughout Alberta. About 30 new school projects opened for students in September and another dozen or so projects will open by the end of 2016.

**Healthcare Optimization:** The Government of Alberta and the Alberta Medical Association (AMA) have achieved a tentative agreement. This agreement is good for doctors, and good for patients. It is a significant step in our promise to slow the growth of health spending while protecting services.

**Southwest Calgary Ring Road:** The construction of the ring road began in September. Please continue to bring all of your individual SWCRR inquiries to our office for a more specific response, but otherwise, please go to www.sw-crr.ca and www.calgary.ca/swrr.

# A Community Centre is a Kind of a Miracle

How do you run a community centre? Lots of goodwill, hard work and a powerful determination to make your little corner of the world a better place. The only way it can work is to bring together a dedicated and passionate group of volunteers willing to give up lots of their time! They'll all have bunches of ideas and powerful voices, and the first part of the miracle is when all the voices and ideas are heard and acted upon; a disparate group recognising their commonalities and drive to improve their neighbourhood, thus creating a powerfully bonded group.

Money is brought in through renting space, memberships, fundraising and grants. Just like any household, sometimes the finances work great and other times there's a need to scramble and watch every nickel. Where do those nickels go? They pay the bills for the building, staff, supplies, and all the necessary fixes needed to keep an aging building in good shape. # Harvest recipes cont'd

Wash beets, leaving on root and 1 inch of tops. Cover beets with boiling water; simmer 25 minutes. Drain. Slip off skins and trim beets. In a large kettle, combine vinegar, water, and sugar. Tie allspice, cloves and cinnamon or nutmeg in a cheesecloth bag. Add spice bag to pickling liquid. Bring to boiling; simmer 15 minutes. Pack beets into hot jars, leaving 1/2-inch headspace. Cover beets with boiling pickling liquid, leaving ½ headspace. Adjust lids. Process in boiling water bath (half-pints) 30 minutes. Makes 3 half-pints. For larger beets after preparing for canning either slice or cube your beets to be able to pack jars more efficiently.
