

Influenza Season

It happens every fall: influenza arrives in Alberta, and takes a serious toll on our communities.

Influenza is a real threat. It's also preventable.

Influenza immunization were made available, starting October 23, free of charge, to all Albertans six months of age and older.

It's the single most effective means of reducing your risk of influenza, particularly when you receive it as early in the season as possible. By getting immunized early, you will give your body the opportunity to respond to immunization, and produce antibodies that will arm you against the influenza viruses you'll be exposed to again throughout the season. Each year, influenza vaccine is developed to protect us against the strains of virus likely to circulate in our community. Though vaccine effectiveness may vary, know this: last season, influenza vaccine cut Albertan's risk of influenza by about 40%. Without immunization, Albertans were completely at risk.

And we do mean all Albertans.

Although some individuals (pregnant women, seniors, children, and individuals with underlying health conditions or compromised immune systems) are at greater risk for severe complications, without immunization, even healthy Albertans are at risk of severe illness and even death.

64 Albertans died with influenza last season, and more than 1,600 Albertans were hospitalized.

Let's do better this year.

Prevention is your protection. Get immunized this season.

Snow Angels

The snowflakes are about to arrive along with cold temperatures (brrr!). Why not start a community Snow Angel campaign? It's a great campaign to get involved and help neighbours. By shovelling snow for each other you can encourage other neighbours to take care of one another!

Benefits of Snow Angels

- People who are less mobile may fear losing the homes they love or having to leave the communities they've lived in for years if they are unable to keep their sidewalks clear. By removing snow for neighbours, you may be able to help them feel secure staying in their homes.
- Paramedics experience a dramatic increase in heartrelated calls after heavy snowfalls. Cold air and heavy

lifting can cause strain on the heart which leads to cardiac distress, especially for the elderly or those with physical ailments.

- 3. Social isolation can contribute to a low quality of life. For some, daily interactions with Snow Angels provide a source of community inclusion and pride.
- 4. Neighbours who know each other are less likely to be victims of crime as people look out for those they know.

Remember residents have just 24 hours after a snow fall to remove snow from sidewalks adjacent to their property.

It's time for everyone to keep food and yard waste out of the garbage

Live in an apartment, condo or townhouse? It's time to keep your food and yard waste out of the garbage. As of November 1, 2017, all multi-family complexes in Calgary are required to separate food and yard waste from the garbage for composting or diversion. Your building owner or manager is responsible for setting up a food and yard waste program in your complex – ask them how it works.

Businesses and organizations are also now required to separate food and yard waste from the garbage. Look for the food waste bin at your workplace, food court or favourite coffee shop. If your multi-family complex or workplace does not offer a food and yard waste program, you can contact 311 for support.

Food and yard waste makes up nearly 40 per cent of garbage from apartments, condos and townhouses, and over 30 per cent from businesses and organizations. Composting will create a useful new product and keep this material out of the landfill.

Glenmore Dam Upgrades

The Glenmore Dam has been key part of Calgary's water infrastructure system since the early 1930s. The wear and tear the dam has experienced over 85 years of service, and the ever-increasing demands of a growing city, mean the time has come for an extensive upgrade. These improvements will not only extend the life of the dam, but will help manage our drinking water supply and give us the ability to better control low and high river flows.

The first phase of the Glenmore Dam Infrastructure Improvements Program was the Utilities Relocation Project. This project involved moving the water and gas utility lines currently running across the top of the dam to a new tunnel excavated underneath the Elbow River. This is needed to allow access to the dam while upgrades are being made, which include a new bridge deck with better access for maintenance and pathway users, concrete work on the face of the dam, and a new steel gate and hoist system.

While the normal maximum operating levels of the reservoir remains the same, the new gate system will provide greater flexibility to manage reservoir storage during low flows in the winter and high flows in the spring.

The pathway across the dam was closed to the public on September 30, 2017, and then until the work is complete in 2020. Pathway detours will be implemented during this time and signage will be available to assist pathway users. (Up to date information on pathway closures, including maps, is available at calgary.ca/pathwayclosures.)

TAKE ON WELLNESS

Doing Sport and Exercise Better

Part Four By Joe Mills

In my last article, I described how without most of us being aware it is likely that our bodies are collapsing because of the unnatural environments we live in, a collapse that not only makes our bodies harder to move but wears them out quicker in the process. And if you're not convinced just ask any mechanic what happens when your car's tires aren't balanced. For example, bigotires.com explains:

Your tires will wear down prematurely when the wheel assembly isn't balanced—and you may be in for some not-so-good vibrations. ... Even a quarter of an ounce of imbalance can put uneven pressure on the treads, causing uneven tread wear and excess heat that shorten the life of the tire.

Now to test whether your body has "even a quarter of an ounce of imbalance", try standing as tall as possible, or sit as tall as possible when next driving your car and adjust your car's mirror to this new height; and then see how long you can maintain your new height and length for, or how hard this height is to maintain. For as soon as you shrink back to your "normal-slightly-shortened" (read collapsed) height, you're putting uneven pressure on your body, making sports and exercise an awful lot harder than needs be.

So, what can we do? Although the most efficient operations of the body are very much debated, we can be clear that—just like your car's chassis—if your pelvis is not in the position it was designed to be in ("neutral"), neither will your spine. And so, you'll have no chance of being able to effortlessly maintain standing as tall as possible... and in turn, performing as well as possible.

To check, imagine your pelvis as a clock face with your belly button at 12 hours, your pubic bone 6 hours and your hip bones 3 and 9 hours respectively. If standing, the plane across this clock face should be perpendicular to the floor, or if lying down it should be parallel to the floor.

Now because our aim is body-efficiency and not bodyeffort, the next critical step is to use only "what we need" to reinforce or maintain this "neutral-pelvic" position, meaning gentle—not maximal—recruitment of the correct—not incorrect—muscles.

Which is why if you're "doing core" by sweating through the plank or wrestling with weights on a bosu-ball, you're highly likely to be cementing and reinforcing the incorrect positions and muscle recruitment patterns in your body: thereby making your body more inefficient not efficient and increasing not decreasing problems.

In other words, engineers and mechanics accept how important it is to balance and look after their structures and machines, but ironically, we as humans don't do the same with our bodies because our knowledge of what to do is skewed in favor of hard—and not morethoughtful—work. Stay tuned to find out how to gently recruit the correct muscles!



If you receive email updates from the UCP Official Opposition caucus, you may have seen a video from our interim leader, Nathan Cooper, talking about the federal government's proposals to change the small business tax code. As Nathan points out in his video, while this is a federal issue, its ramifications go far beyond the realms of the federal government, and as such it is what I want to focus on in this newsletter column.




