

Flames Back Cancer Fight

Glendale's Ed Carnegie celebrated at Saddledome

Ed and Monique Carnegie, Glendale originals who have lived in the neighbourhood since the 1950s, were given royal treatment at a recent Calgary Flames game on Hockey Fights Cancer Night.

Ed, 86, was diagnosed with cancer this summer and he has been fighting his battle with family and friends nearby.

Ed was born in Edmonton and grew up playing competitive hockey through Junior A and really never gave up the game. He played three mornings a week until just four years ago, when he hung up his skates at age 82.

When Flames public relations man Sean Kelso heard about Ed's story, he invited the Carnegies down to an NHL game against the Ottawa Senators on a Friday night. During a break in the action, Ed was surprised by legendary broadcaster Peter Maher who presented him with a personalized jersey as 18,000 Saddledome fans gave Ed a standing ovation.

"Ed, as you face the fight of your life, we want you to know that the entire C of Red is behind you as you

continue your battle against this disease," said P.A. announcer Beasley. "On behalf of the entire C of Red, we are all with you, Ed!"


After the Flames victory, Ed and Monique were ushered into the Flames lockerroom and chatted with captain Mark Giordano, Johnny Gaudreau, T.J. Brodie and General Manager Brad Treliving.

"You couldn't possibly know how much that special evening meant to Ed and myself," said Monigue. "It was magical. We try hard to make every day count because the time we have with the ones we love is never long enough."

It is lifelong residents like the Carnegies who have made Glendale the wonderful community it is, and the community is behind you, too, Ed and Monique.

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

About 75 Glendale residents came to our board meeting last month to hear from the city about the Main Streets development plans for 37th Street SW on the east boundary of Glendale.

City planners Kevin Barton and Jyde Heaven did an excellent job outlining the proposal for Glendale as residents came armed with lots of questions about the proposals being put forward under municipal guidelines to increase density in neighbourhoods close to the core and along transit corridors..

Parking, building heights, infrastructure and road access to new developments were some of the concerns raised.

Glendale is currently governed by an R-C1 zoning that limits most properties to single family developments. Under the new proposals, 37th Street would be rezoned to allow four storey residential buildings and mixed-use residential commercial structures closer to 26th Avenue. City proposals would also see the east side of 38th Street SW rezoned to allow higher density housing such as townhomes or infills up to three storeys.

Ward 6 Councillor Richard Pootmans let residents know that higher density developments seem inevitable for Glendale.

Your community board is continuing to work with the city planners, who hope to make a recommendation to Council in 2017.

"Change is coming and we can either let properties be redeveloped one piece at a time or try to work with the city on a structured plan that will revitalize 37th Street," said Glendale president Paul McCormick. "We need to know exactly how the affected residents feel about detailed proposals and represent their views to the city."

As always, we are starting out the season with our Christmas Party for the Animals, a free family event, on December 3, 2016. All December long we will also be collecting treats and toys for the shelter pets to enjoy on Christmas morning, as part of our "Stuff a Pooch Pad" campaign. At Calgary Humane Society we believe that every pet should have a special festive season, so with that in mind we are bringing you our top suggestions on how to make the holidays fun and safe for you and your pet!

- 1. Distract Fido with special treats! Having family and friends join you for a meal is a fantastic holiday tradition, and with a little creativity your pet can also join the dinner fun. Freezing hard rubber "Kong" toys stuffed with soft food is not only a delicious indulgence, it can also distract Fido while you enjoy dinner in peace!



As we approach the end of 2016, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on a few of the events of this past year since being elected Member of Parliament for Calgary Signal Hill.

I was privileged to be selected vice chair of the House of Commons Finance committee and it has been a busy 12 months. The Standing Committee held pre-budget consultations earlier this year prior to the introduction of the 2016 budget. The timeframe between the consultations and introduction of the budget was too short to have much impact on the actual document introduced in the House. Pre-budget consultations for the 2017 budget have just concluded and hopefully more of what was heard in our travels across the country will actually find its way into the budget next spring.

An important piece of legislation that was introduced this past year was Bill C-14 – Medical Assistance in Dying. Based on constituent feedback, I voted in favor of the bill which will provide comfort to many who face an end of life decision.

2017 will mark Canada's 150th Birthday and celebrations will occur throughout the year. Please feel free to contact our constituency office if you are planning an event and are looking for items you can use for this exciting occasion.

Locally, we are all too aware of the economic hardships that many Albertans are facing with the downturn in the economy and unfortunately the next 12 months may be just as difficult. Although we are seeing some small increases in commodity prices, industry will not make major investments until the situation stabilizes. 2017 will also see the conclusion of most capital projects still under construction in Alberta and there is little on the drawing board for the future. This is one time when I hope I am totally wrong but indications for the next period of time continue to be worrisome.

In addition, the devastating fires in Fort McMurray displaced many families from their homes and with the help of Albertans, we are now in a period of rebuild. This fall has also been difficult for the agriculture community as many fields remain unharvested due to the

weather. All of these difficulties makes this time of year hard on many families. I would ask that you continue to show the compassion and generosity we are known for by helping out neighbors and associations that are endeavoring to ease the burden on those affected during this holiday season.

Please let me express my sincere gratitude for your support and feedback over this past year and I look forward to representing you in Ottawa in 2017. Wishing you, your family, and friends a safe and joyous holiday season.

As we enter this time of holidays and festive gatherings, I am reminded just how fortunate I am to have family extended across Western Canada.

This time is a time we set aside for coming together, taking part and remembering the things we value most in our lives.

When I look at the news from across the region, I am startled at just how many of our young people are dying from opioid overdose. It is alarming the number of people who so swiftly fall under the spell of these incredibly powerful drugs.

While fentanyl is killing our friends, our families, our neighbours, no one chooses fentanyl, no one chooses overdose.

When we hear about another death from this deadly drug it is important to remember that this is not the beginning, this is not where this person started their journey.

Many first time opioid users come by them legitimately, many taking Tylenol 3 when they have their wisdom teeth removed, and for most, the story of their opioid use ends when the prescription runs out. Others come to it on the street by virtue of predatory drug dealers, looking to upsell new clients on more impressive highs. The insidious nature of opioid drugs is that no matter how you come to it, its ability to hook our bodies makes

it too easy for the fine line between a drug being medicine and harmful substance to get blurred, and physical addition creeps in.

By the time we hear about a Fentanyl overdose, the user has been scraping the bottom of the barrel for some time, strung out and abandoned by mainstream society, and welcomed into the open arms of the opioid drug trade. When being wrapped in the warm embrace of an opioid rush, the only thing that matters is the rush, when no one else seems to care who you are. Addictions strike fast and conditions can debilitate an individual faster than they can realize what is happening. It is an incredibly difficult path to walk alone, and recovery almost never occurs without a supportive environment.

I am so proud that our government is taking a stand, and making progress in combatting the debilitating effects of opioid addiction. While working on harm-reduction programs, we are also aiming to tackle the root causes of substance abuse through investment in prevention and research programs. Free Public Wi-Fi

Canada Post volunteers donate over 200,000 hours of their time each year to help Santa respond to every letter that arrives on his doorstep.

Public Wi-Fi is a City program that provides Wi-Fi service in select city facilities or locations. The City has partnered with Shaw; the service is available to any member of the public at no charge. Shaw is providing Shaw Open (available to Shaw customers), and Shaw Guest (available free to the public, with the creation of an account).

Expanding public Wi-Fi to public spaces like recreation centres and CTrain stations is part of the City of Calgary's Customer Commitment. It's about investing in projects and initiatives that positively impact the customer experience. You can currently access public Wi-Fi at several LRT stations and City of Calgary facilities, please visit calgary.ca/publicwifi for a complete list.

Calgary Transit is currently working with Shaw to install Wi-Fi on the West (Blue) LRT line. Cable and mounting installs are underway and public Wi-Fi is anticipated to be available by the end of the year.

Snow & Ice

Before you step out of the house after a sprinkle or a dump, be sure to check **calgary.ca/snow.** You can type in your address to see if you are affected by a snow route parking ban, and when to expect clearing in your community. This one-stop-shop for all things snow and ice also has road conditions, and pathway and sidewalk snow clearing maps. You can stay up-to-date on expected weather conditions and Calgary Transit service updates if you use public transit to get around. Be sure to check here for how to prepare for a heavy snowfall as well as FAOs. Use this portal to report a problem to 311. Stay safe this winter season and be prepared for whatever weather comes our wav!

Christmas Tree Recycling Program

By recycling your real Christmas trees, you help keep 35,000 trees out of the landfill! This helps our collection crews stay on schedule during a busy time. Each January, the City collects real Christmas trees from homes that receive black cart garbage collection. Temporary drop-off locations are also available if you do not receive black cart garbage collection. Please remove all decorations, tinsel, plastic and string before placing your tree out for collection. You can leave your real Christmas tree next to your black cart which will be chipped into mulch and made available for residents for garden/yard use, which can be picked up for free from the East Calgary Landfill.
