

We need labour, equipment and materials to plan capital growth and ensure regular maintenance, such as fixing our roof, tending our green space and keeping our ice rink ready for skating all winter. 

Green Carts are coming this summer

Starting this June, green carts will be rolled out to all households for food and yard waste collection. Here are some details on the rollout.


Green cart collection start dates

Green carts will be rolled out by quadrant. Once all residents in a quadrant have their carts, collection will begin as follows:

Quadrant	Cart delivery	Weekly green cart collection starts:
Southwest	June 5 - July 15	Week of July 17
Northwest	July 3 - August 12	Week of August 14
Northeast	August 7 - September 2	Week of September 4
Southeast	August 28 - September 30	Week of October 2



Weekly green cart collection starts



Three things to do when your cart arrives:

- 1. Bring your cart up to your home.**
Carts will be delivered to the front of your home. Bring your cart up to your home and store it in a safe place (e.g. garage, against the side of your house or back fence).
- 2. Look inside the green cart.**
Everything you need to get started is inside the cart. This includes:
 - Kitchen pail and sample compostable bags.
 - Sample paper yard waste bags for extra yard waste that doesn't fit inside the cart.
 - Instruction guide and collection schedule.
- 3. Consult your collection schedule.**
The collection schedule inside your cart explains when green cart collection starts in your quadrant along with your new collection days and schedule. You can also find out your collection days and sign up for free automated reminders at calgary.ca/collection.

I hope that this message finds you and your family well, and enjoying the warmer weather.

As you are likely aware, the Trudeau Government recently tabled legislation that would legalize marijuana. The government contends that too many young Canadians end up with criminal records for possessing small amounts of the drug.

I want to share with you some of the important aspects of the legislation and ask for your thoughts and feedback for our Opposition Caucus on how we handle this important file.

The new legislation would legalize marijuana for those over 18 and allow possession of up to 30 grams. It would also allow for individuals to grow 4 marijuana plants on their property or buy from a licensed distributor. Police would be given the power to use saliva based tests if they suspect someone is driving under the influence of the drug. The bill also prohibits marketing to youth, sales through vending machines, and clarifies laws surrounding driving under the influence of either alcohol or drugs.

There are a number of areas where the bill does not specifically spell out the Government's approaches to handling some key practical issues when it comes to legalizing marijuana. For example, it doesn't give us any perspective on how the government intends to tax these products nor how they will be distributed (the later will likely be left to the provinces). Our caucus has also expressed some concerns on whether the Government's efforts to keep marijuana out of the hands of young people will be effective.

The government wants the new law to take effect July 1, 2018 which is a very aggressive timeline. Provincial and municipal governments will be responsible for policing, by-law enforcement and a number of issues that will result in significant costs.

Our official opposition caucus will continue to question the government on dealing with these unresolved issues and I would appreciate hearing your perspective. Please call my office at 403-292-6666 or email Ron.Liepert.c1a@parl.gc.ca with your thoughts and comments.

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This June marks two years since you promoted me from the shop floor to the Legislature floor as your representative in a government led by Rachel Notley. Every day since, our government has been working hard to implement meaningful policies and programs that provide stability and affordability for Alberta families. In fact, we have fulfilled 73% of our 2015 election platform, with another 15% in the process of being completed this legislative session.

This year alone, 380,000 children in 199,000 families across Alberta and right here in Calgary Currie will be helped by the Alberta Family Employment Tax Credit and the new Alberta Child Benefit. Bill 1 has reduced mandatory school fees by 25%. And a new agreement with the federal government prioritizes the hiring of Alberta workers in 29 high-wage jobs including civil and mechanical engineers, machinists, electricians, plumbers and carpenters meaning as jobs continue to return, Albertans will be at the front of the line.

My work continues on introducing Henson Trust legislation in Alberta. This month I am excited to launch a second round of consultations beginning in Lethbridge on Saturday, June 10 at the Lethbridge Senior Citizens Centre. If you have family or friends in Southern Alberta who would like to participate - or if you yourself would like to speak to me about Henson Trust legislation - please contact my office. I continue to be overwhelmed by the support this initiative has received to date, and by working together we can ensure this becomes a reality.

As the legislative session winds down later this month, I look forward to getting out and meeting more of you at the many summer community events in and around Calgary Currie such as Lilac Festival on June 4. I will be hosting my 2nd annual Stampede Breakfast at the Glenbrook Community Association on Sunday, July 9th - all are welcome! If you want to volunteer by flipping pancakes, let me know.

Big news for Ward 6 this month—Green Carts are coming!

Calgarians have embraced our successful Blue Cart recycling program, and we're excited to launch the Green Cart program for food and yard waste city-wide! This allows us to divert 65% of Calgary's waste to create nutrient-rich compost for the soil in gardens, parks, and local farms. The program also keeps material out of our limited existing landfills to avoid significant future costs.

Everything including banana peels, animal bones, cooking oil, paper tissues, grass clippings, branches, and kitty litter can be composted at our advanced composting facility. A portion of the finished compost will also be made available to the community for free!

Ward 6 is in the SW quadrant and will be the first phase in the roll-out. When your cart arrives, you can expect:

- A green cart, the same size as the blue and black carts.
- A kitchen pail for collecting food waste in the home.
- Samples of compostable bags to line the kitchen pail.
- Samples of paper yard waste bags to use for extra yard waste that doesn't fit inside the cart.
- A three-month collection schedule explaining your new collection days.
- Instruction guide that explains the new service.

Starting the week of July 17, your green and blue carts will be picked up every week on the same day. Thus, we ask that you start filling your green carts starting July 10 and no sooner, to prevent bin overflow or excessive decomposition. Since the majority of your garbage can be recycled or composted, black carts will change and be picked up once every two weeks on a different day.

The savings achieved by changing Black Cart collection to once every two weeks will be re-invested into the program in order to reduce the Green Cart monthly rate to \$6.50/month.

Need a little help? Go to calgary.ca/collection to confirm your dates, and also get free reminders via email, text,

calls, calendars, or download the Calgary Garbage Day app on your phone!

A reminder: Starting on November 1, Bylaw requires multi-family units (apartments, condos) and businesses to separate food and yard waste for composting or diversion as well. Building owners/managers can choose a service provider as well as how to manage the service for their residents and tenants.
