

## Happy Birthday Killarney Pool Playground!

As Chelsea and I stood at the playground today 1 year on - we saw a mom with a 5 month old struggling to convince her toddler to leave the playground for dinner. The by-standing grandma said "isn't it great to see him having so much fun though?" and the mom smiled gently, saying it was his favourite place to play. Just then my daughter ran into an old preschool classmate and introduced her to Chelsea's son and no sooner did they then race off playing tag together zigzagging and climbing all over the structure. What a perfect fall evening to illustrate how a playground can bring so much connectivity in a neighbourhood. Exactly what we had envisioned 3 years ago when we were meeting with suppliers on site with our own babes in arms.

Here is what your first impressions were last year:

- "I didn't even know the playground existed before the project. Now I don't have to travel across the city to play on rubber surfacing, I can invite friends to play at ours!"
- Most improved was: Safety, rubber surfacing, fun feature items, better interactivity
- 85% said the project improved their sense of community because the new playground filled a gap and through it, you have met new people
- 90% of you said that because of this project, it would has made you more willing to participate in future projects

## ...imagine.... LEADERSHIP BY STEWARDSHIP



General Dwight D. Eisenhower once famously said. "in preparing for battle I have always found that plans are useless but planning is indispensable". He was expressing gratitude in 1957 at the National

Defense Executive Reserve Conference for the planning that they had made before the Second World War and how it had turned the tide of the war in the Allies favour.

With long term planning in mind, the Board of the Killarney Glengarry Community Association met in September to plan for our future as a Community. This was our 4th Annual Strategic Planning session. The three previous years we developed our Vision, Mission, Values and Goals and in 2015 we wrote our Business Plan that the City of Calgary now requires all community organizations to develop.

It is an interesting and valuable exercise because it causes a group to sit down annually to actually think about who they serve, why they serve them and what their legacy should be. One of the valuable outcomes is that one begins to think about 'stewardship' - what it is and what it means for a community.





As a word, Stewardship means 'the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care'. Good stewardship allows any organization to continuously develop and adjust to an ever-changing world. It means

that the stewards will act in the "common good" or the best interests of everyone. It doesn't work as well in a hierarchical or top down organization. It works best in a

collaborative, collegial, cooperative place that benefits everyone.

For me, stewardship is acting upon the understanding that leadership is a temporary role which is outlasted by the lifespan of an organization; that life went on before the current leaders arrived and that history is important and relevant to today's organization. And, life will go on after they leave and the real test will be the legacy they leave - will it be powerful and lasting or will it be a missed opportunity? The current Board is working hard to ensure that by preparing for the future we will leave the community vital and vibrant for those who come after us.


Another powerful concept, that deserves our reflection today, is the words from the first treaties with England in 1692 with the Indigenous people that will be "in force for as long as the sun shines upon the earth; as long as the waters flow; as long as the grass grows green' - that is the real essence of stewardship.

Another concept of stewardship is "The Seventh Generation Principle" and is based on an ancient Iroquois philosophy, "The Great Law of Iroquois Confederacy" that the decisions we make today should result in a sustainable world seven generations into the future. The actual date of these earliest writings is undetermined, but it is thought to originate anywhere from 1142 to 1500 AD - so sustainability is not a new idea but it seems to be an idea that our modern society has forgotten



as we now design appliances to last for 5 - 7 years to keep the economy moving.

The Great Law of Iroquois Confederacy is also credited as being the contributing influence on the 1787 American Constitution because Benjamin Franklin, who was working with George Washington on the document, particularly liked the ideas of political stability, individual freedom, economic growth and social progress that the new Constitution espoused.



Your Board is working hard to make decisions that are good now and will sustain this great community in the long term, too! We would love to hear from you about how you think we're doing.





#### We Remember

As November 11<sup>th</sup> approaches, I hope you once again take time to remember those that have sacrificed, those that continue to take on the perilous work of safeguarding Canadian freedoms, and the soldiers who are now representing us abroad as peacekeepers.

It is my honour and pleasure to serve as our nation's Minister of Veterans Affairs. In this role I am entrusted with the mandate to support our veterans – young and old – and in the commemoration of all of Canada's past conflicts.

Just one of the memories that I will be reflecting on this month is the impact of the First World War on Western Canada High School where some 170 Old Boys and 6 Masters had enlisted by 1916. The Calgary Herald estimated some 40% of all the boys who ever attended the college had enlisted and went off to war: and you can see this sacrifice memorialized at the cenotaph today just behind the school. Young men, with their entire futures in front of them, were brought into one of the world's most brutal conflicts and sacrificed themselves our freedoms. It is a story I think of often when I attend ceremonies across this country and serve as Minister of Veterans Affairs.

I invite you to look online on my ministry's website at http://www.veterans.gc.ca/eng/events to see what events are in our community.

Now, it has been nearly a year since I was appointed by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau as a member of his cabinet. In last year's election campaign we promised Canadians a government that would uphold our sacred obligation to veterans.

In Budget 2016 the Government of Canada put **\$5.6 billion** additional dollars into Veterans Affairs, showcasing a clear commitment to bettering the lives of our nation's heroes.

This year we have announced the re-openings of the nine Veterans Affairs offices closed by the previous gov-

ernment. In addition to reopening these much needed offices – which support veterans across this country – we are also opening an extra office in Surrey, BC, to support the thousands of veterans who live in that city. Above and beyond this we have increased benefits to veterans by increasing the Earning Loss Benefit to 90% from 75%, increased the Disability Award and are on track to hire up to 400 more frontline staff. With increasing benefits and frontline staff we can better support veterans and make sure they transition smoother into civilian life.

It is in this sacred trust I continue to work to better the lives of veterans and keep the promises we made in the 2015 election.

November is here, and that means that the Legislature is back in session, and my life gets even busier than it has been.

When I'm out and about in the community, people often ask me "Why? It's not like there's an election soon?" My answer is simple: How else can I honestly represent the entire riding if I don't know how people living here are feeling?

If I want to be a true conduit for the ebb and flow of the communities I represent, it is essential that I know what's actually going on in those communities.

So when I walk in to the legislature, when I sit in committees, I am always thinking about people here in Calgary Currie whose lives will be touched by the legislation at hand. I think about the kind of stories they have told me. Stories about their successes, and stories about the problems they are facing.

When I'm door knocking I hear all sorts of stories. Neighborhood kids come up and ask about a playground in their area, and I'll meet a senior who is having difficulty getting out to socialize, or a drywall professional facing a downturn in construction. To know about the lives people are leading, to know what is going on in their life, to then take that to the Legislature, is one of the things that gives me my greatest strength when I speak in the chamber.

The story of Alberta is one that builds on the past and continues today. It is a story that is being carried forward in the daily lives we lead, in the daily trials and tribulations we face; It is a story being written every day by each and everyone one of us who plays a part of the Calgary Currie Community.

I will also make note that just like for the past 98 years, November is the month we take time aside and remember those who have had their lives taken in the service of their country. Remembrance Day ceremonies are held at the Military Museums, as well as the local Killarney Legion, and of course at the Cenotaph downtown.

With no effort at all, she moved gracefully from roof to fence to the ground, walked through another yard and across 25A St to continue her business. She looked to be about 40 lbs, sleek and healthy with spectacular colouring. Stunningly beautiful!

We wanted to be certain what we saw - was it a bobcat or was she a lynx? Google assured us it was a bobcat diagnostic by the length of her tail. Each year there are a few bobcat sightings - this year there have been 2 or 3 so it is not common to see them in the city. #### **Snow and Ice Control**

We know how to do winter in Calgary, and when it comes to clearing the snow and ice from our roads and pathways, we're getting better all the time. Throughout the winter months and especially after a big dump of snow, Calgary Roads has crews available around the clock to sand, salt and plow. Here's how it works:

#### Before the Snow Falls

Even before it snows, City crews are busy anti-icing roadways to reduce the accumulation of ice and snow on the roads. A Road Salt Management Plan is followed to improve environmental protection without compromising road safety. The City also uses snow fences as part of

the annual winter road maintenance program. Over 140 strategically placed snow fences reduce the build-up of drifting snow and ice on roads, and help to keep winter roads safe by improving visibility for motorists.

#### **During and After the Snow Falls**

The City sands, salts, and plows roads and select sidewalks based on a priority system, and all work is to be completed within seven days from the point a snowfall ends. Within 24 hours of the end of a snowfall, major roadways (Priority 1) with traffic volumes over 20,000 vehicles per day are completely plowed, sanded and salted. A Snow Route Parking Ban may also be declared during this time – visit www.calgary.ca to find out. Within 48 hours, all Priority 2 roadways are completed; this includes bus routes, problem areas and roads that carry over 5,000 vehicles per day. Work then continues on Priority 3 and 4 roadways, focusing on designated hills and slower speed zones, and eventually moving on to sidewalks and pathways.

#### What You Can Do

The City of Calgary has a very sophisticated Snow and Ice Control program, and it does great work every year, but residents need to pitch in as well.

- When you drive in the winter, don't fool around: get winter tires.
- When you cycle in the winter, perform regular maintenance on your bike.
- When you walk in the winter, wear shoes with good grip.
- Homeowners are responsible for removing snow and ice from parking spaces, driveways and sidewalks.
- Be patient, and let the City follow the Seven Day Snow Event Plan. If something isn't right, however, report it to 3-1-1.
- Drive, cycle and walk safely. Give yourself extra time, don't rush, and be courteous to others.
