...imagine.... CALGARY: SMARTER GROWTH

Albertans are making babies - 17,883 in the first quarter of 2016! Seems astonishing, but considering that Alberta's median age is 36.1, life happens!

Despite the downturn in Alberta's economy, Alberta's population continues to grow and is not declining. We are the fastest growing province in Canada this year -

in addition to the babies, 12,050 new immigrants arrived and Alberta's death rate is only 1/3 of our birth rate. The 1788 people that left Alberta - most of them headed for BC - didn't affect the population rate much.



If we look globally what's

happening to cities around the world, we are staggered that the UN Habitat reports that three million people are moving to cities every day. Currently 54% of people live in cities, and by 2040, 70% of us will have moved to cities. That means that all cities around the world have to be prepared to receive them.

Some smart, ambitious people migrate to cities; they want better or different lives. Many of us have moved from smaller towns like Swift Current to Calgary for education and jobs. Later we find that grandparents arrive to be near their grandchildren and the evolution continues.

So, how can cities be ready for this? The Smarter Growth Initiative is a concept that the City of Calgary has adopted to ensure that the city is not overwhelmed in future because of lack of preparation. This idea supports economic growth, strong communities and environmental health. We know from experience that if you don't

do these things, chaos and civil unrest occur and cit-ative ies are destroyed. Growth^{id in} Smarter translates intos enhanced qualityal




of daily life, curbs unnecessary suburban growth, preserves the natural environment, saves money, and is, therefore, sustainable over time.

It means that homes and streets are designed on a human scale, people can live close to where they work, walking and biking are encouraged and kids go to daycare and school close to home - communities, like Killarney, will be complete communities.

It's happening in Calgary; older neighbourhoods like Kensington and Inglewood have worked hard to main-

tain their character; newer communities like Garrison Woods and McKenzie Town boast an impressive mix of commercial, residential and recreational facilities.

The City of Calgary reports that "study after study shows intelligent urbanization leads to better health, stronger economies,



Using this model, urban expansion slows as communities become denser. Another significant factor is that younger people want different housing options. Royal Lepage has done research that tells us that 59% of Gen Yers want diversity in housing choices; 17% of a portion of down payments are contributed by family members; 70% of the Gen Yers want to work remotely some of the time; 76% place high value in walkable communities and 62% want a mix of living, shopping, dining and office space in their own communities.

Gen Yers are not shy about telling us about what they deem as important parts of their worlds. They are seeking more flexible mortgage rules, good internet connectivity, less reliance on automobiles, and a local village feel where they live.

Another significant portion of the population is seeking other amenities. There are more people over 65 than ever before, and by 2036, for the first time in our history, the number of adults over 65 will surpass the number of children aged 14 and under in Calgary. The percentage of seniors doubled between 1936 and 2006. It will take just 30 years to double again between 2006 and 2036 - a huge growth rate.

Seniors are healthier and more active in their communities than ever before. More than 60% of them volunteer regularly - a formidable work force that make huge contributions to Calgary. Seniors today are better educated, living longer, culturally diverse, tech savvy and wealthier overall. Most of them prefer to 'age in place'. A study by Concordia University professor Zachary Patterson showed that in 1991, 33% of seniors were relocating towards city centres. In 2006, that number was only 18%. What we know now is that seniors want to 'age in place' - living in their 'forever homes'.

This is an exciting time in Calgary and in Killarney - it's a dichotomy really, with the decline of oil prices we're

seeing more layoffs, more entrepreneurial spirit and trying to plan for a burgeoning city at the same time. It brings challenges and opportunities - mak-



ing the best of them will test our mettle and determine who we really are.

Sir Winston Churchill knew this 80 years ago when he observed that 'we shape our cities and our cities shape us'. True!



One Year In

Time sure flies. It has been one year since I was elected to be Calgary Centre's representative in our nation's capital. I had the pleasure of running on an aggressive platform for the middle class and we are well on the way to implementing the changes that we were elected to do. Let me give you an update on some of the projects that we've been working on as a government.

In Budget 2016 our government brought into force the newer, fairer, and tax-free Canada Child Benefit which will put approximately \$930 million into the pockets of Albertan families, and give Calgarians more money to save, invest, and grow the economy. Nine out of ten families will see more money and on the whole this policy change will raise some 300,000 children out of poverty.

As for our commitments to seniors – we moved the chains of justice forward by restoring the eligibility age for Old Age Security (OAS) and Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) to 65; and introduced a Seniors Price index to keep OAS and GIS at pace with the rising costs faced by seniors each year. Further to this we increased the Guaranteed Income Supplement for single, low income seniors by 10%, improving the financial security of about 900,000 single seniors across Canada.

Budget 2016 invests \$2.3 billion over two years to give Canadians greater access to more affordable housing. Our Government has already started to engage provinces and territories, Indigenous and other communities, and key stakeholders to develop a National Housing Strategy. This marks a return for the Government of Canada back to the table to play a leadership role in supporting affordable housing.

With regards to my portfolio of Veterans Affairs – my ministry is reopening the nine Veterans Affairs offices closed by the previous Conservative government, along with opening an extra one to continue our commitment to doing more for our veterans. This is in addition to in-

Finally, the energy file this past year has been a focus of this new government with a combined effort by my cabinet colleagues. It is in this whole-of-government approach that we are reforming our regulatory framework, growing Canadians' trust in building energy projects, and working to getting our product to tidewater. By investing in indigenous communities, putting billions into the environment work we do at home and abroad, and improving the process, progress is being made.

Listening is My Job

As Councillor for Ward 8, my first job is to listen. All of the other work I do; be it reading a report, sitting in a committee meeting, advocating in the media or speaking out for my ward in Council, is totally dependent on hearing your voices. The ways in which I stay connected are about as diverse as Ward 8 itself: Emails, phone calls, letters, newsletters, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and community associations are just a few. Of course, nothing beats meeting someone in person, looking them in the eye, and hearing what they have to say.

It's important that I continue this dialogue with you throughout my term in office. I want to hear your thoughts about our Ward 8 neighbourhoods and our growing city. Here are a few subjects to start off our conversation:

Green Cart Composting

Sustainable and thoughtful development is critical for our city's future. By this time next year, all single family homes in Calgary will be provided a Green Cart for composting. While composting might be new to some, the impact it can and will have on our landfills is really significant. Organic waste from Calgarians can be turned into compost can help our city in so many ways. It can go towards bettering our parks, helping small urban farming initiatives like The Alex's Community Food Centre or even offering options for renewable energy.

Affordable Housing

Not only must we accommodate the enormous pressures of growth that Calgary faces, but I believe that our greater community is only as good as it gives to those less fortunate. Therefore, affordable housing is a critical part of my work as Councillor. I'm proud that Council recently approved the Rosedale affordable housing project but that's a small step along a very long path. Some of the most important work we can do as citizens is increasing our capacity for empathy and understanding. Calgary currently has 56,000 people who are one paycheck or one rent increase away from housing instability. So, when you picture someone who is at risk of being homeless, the reality is that it could be someone much closer to you than you think.

Safety in the Inner City

Most of the communities in Ward 8 are within Calgary's inner city. So many of these neighbourhoods are growing and our services have kept up very well with the changes. Our infrastructure needs to adapt as well, and this is why I am pushing hard, for example, to upgrade the underpasses across the CP Rail tracks to make them safer, more convenient and more pedestrian-friendly. We've had some great successes as the 1st Street SW underpass is nearly complete and we've secured funding to start the renovation of the 4th Street SW underpass. We'll continue to work to make walking in the inner city safer and more enjoyable for all Calgarians.

I want to envision and build the future of our city together, and to do that I need to hear your voice.
