Celebrate Canada's Sesquicentennial Birthday*

This land we live on has been inhabited for millennia by Aboriginal peoples. It wasn't until 1535 that a small colony of French settlers made a claim on the area. Since then, we have grown to 36 million people. We live in a huge country, the second largest on the planet. We sparsely populate this great land, most of us living within 150 kms of the 49th parallel.

We are known as the most multi-cultural country in the world and the home of immigrants of every ethnic and religious group from every country in the world - indeed, we are multi-cultural!

The name Canada has been in use since the founding of the French colony in the 16th century. The name originates from an Iroquios-Huron word kanata (or canada) for settlement, land or village, and was adapted by Jacques Cartier during his trip along the St. Lawrence river in 1535.

As a consequence of various conflicts, the United Kingdom gained and lost territories within British North America until late in the 18th century with what mostly geographically comprises Canada today. The British North America Act on July 1, 1867, formed the legal entity of the federal Dominion of Canada.




From these modest beginnings, Canada has gained a place in the world as being one of the best. In May, 2016, a report by the US News & World Report, including the

Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania, millennials (18 - 35 year olds) expressed Canada as the best overall country in the world!! Imagine that! Germany and the UK followed Canada's #1 rating. We are also ranked #1 for our Quality of Life.

And why is Canada so special you might ask? Well, first we have an abundance of water, and it is good water. Studies have shown that no North American bottled water is safer or better than what comes out of our taps. That is not to say that we don't have to improve the quality of water on Indigenous lands - we're working on it!

We're educated. According to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) report on Global Education, Canada has the highest proportion of college grads at 51%. That makes us the most educated country on earth! One of the bright spots in the 2016 Index is that education has kept pace with the economic growth.

Tommy Douglas believed in improving the lives of ordinary Canadians and introduced Canada's first Health Care system in Saskatchewan in 1962. He was so pivotal in creating the Canada we know today of looking after each other, that in 2004 Tommy Douglas was named "The Greatest Canadian" based on a Canada-wide survey.



Canada is a significant economic player in the world. We are a high tech industrial society with a high standard of living. While the service sector is Canada's biggest economic driver, we are a significant exporter of energy, food and minerals. Canada ranks third in proven oil reserves and is the world's fifth largest oil producer.

In 2016, the National Index of Well-being notes we're sacrificing the importance of leisure and culture since the 2008 recession and it points out that women are still struggling with the 'time crunch' of too much to do with little down time.

We are a tolerant and peaceful nation. We're not the best according to the United Nations Global Peace Index, but we're close to the top of the rankings. Iceland, Denmark, and New Zealand are the most peaceful. Canada is ranked #4.

Safety is a key factor for international students in their decision to study in Canada.

As Canadians, we are so fortunate to live in this country. As an adventure traveller who has an opportunity to see how other people live, I kiss the ground I live on and I pay my taxes with a smile. None of us should take for granted the great privilege it is to be Canadian. Happy 150th Birthday to us all in 2017! *The Canada 150 logo is composed of a series of diamonds or "celebratory gems" arranged in the shape of the iconic maple leaf. The four



diamonds at the base represent the four original provinces that formed in 1867; Ontario, Ouebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. Additional diamonds extend out from the base to create nine more points - in total representing the 13 provinces and territories.

The logo was created by Ariana Cuvin from Toronto, Ontario and was the winning design in a nationwide competition. Ariana was chosen from a field of 300 entries.

The logo is an evocative symbol that all Canadians are invited to use to celebrate this 150th year of Canada's very special place in the world as a peaceful and caring nation.

2016: Another **Fantastic Gardening Year!**

With the gardening season far from our memories, we iust want to let community members know that it was another successful year with all the garden plots.

We rented out all of the garden plots for the 2016 year.

The season started out a bit slow with gardeners taking time to plant, but eventually, everyone's got in.

Luckily, all the rain helped and the the gardens appeared to take off and produce a nice bounty of a variety of vegetables from kale to char, carrots to beans, beets and lettuce, squashes and even some potatoes.

The gardeners had the composting bins repaired and labelled and we hope that users will make note and abide by what each bin has so that the compost can "work". We ask all users to regularly water and turn the compost, not just dump more in. This will help us to use the compost next spring. Also, please do not use compostable plastic bags as these take a very long time to decompose.

We ask all community members to not dump garbage in the area.



Approving, and Building, Energy Projects

As Prime Minister Justin Trudeau wrote in his mandate letter to my colleague Natural Resources Minister James Carr: "it is a core responsibility of the federal government to help get our natural resources to market..." It is a clear direction, by both this government and yours truly, to gain access to tidewater for Alberta's products and to exporting energy abroad, and was why we approved both Trans Mountain and Line 3 on November 29th, 2016.

However, as the Prime Minister has emphasized time and time again, the only way to get resources to market in the twenty-first century is if they are done **sustainably** and **responsibly**. The environment and the economy are two sides of the same coin, and it is not possible to achieve long term economic success without having the trust of the Canadian people, support by Indigenous Peoples', and allaying local concerns.

This is why we are working with the provinces and territories to develop a Canadian Energy Strategy. It's why our government has committed \$1.5 billion over the next five years to have a world-leading Oceans Protection Plan to safeguard our coasts and invest in the transportation corridors that gain access for all of Canada's products abroad.

It's why our government is moving forward with putting a price on carbon pollution, which will give us a competitive edge internationally and incent the marketplace to innovate to build a clean-growth economy. This will also have the additional effect of safeguarding Canadian's health and clean air, and bring new and exciting job prospects for middle-class Canadians.

It's why, in the fall of 2016, our government approved Pacific Northwest. This project has an estimated total capital investment of up to \$36 billion and is one of Canada's largest resource development projects. This project will provide some 4,500 middle class jobs during construction and 630 indirect/direct jobs during its operation.

It's why we are ensuring the environmental risks linked to development are addressed by industry before projects proceed. The Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency took in a ground-breaking 34,000 comments from the public, and was granted a three-month extension to the timeline to ensure we had the science right. Northwest will be required to comply with specific mitigation measures that will minimize adverse effects on fish habitat, wetlands, human health, and on Indigenous peoples. And for the first time ever, annual greenhouse gas emissions for the project have been capped at a maximum level that is substantially lower than initially envisaged for the project.

These decisions reflect our promise to work with provinces, indigenous peoples and Canadians to find practical solutions that will grow our economy, create good jobs and protect our environment for future generations.


In Alberta we take matters into our own hands. While we see the need for occasional hand-outs, we far prefer hand ups. Give us the tools we need to succeed and we will succeed.
