

Your Killarney-Glengarry Community Association Hall is available for rental use at competitive rates, with preferred rates for KGCA members. The KGCA Hall is a valuable resource for the citizens of Killarney-Glengarry. When you hold your birthday parties, special events, team parties, and group meetings there, you invest in your community

Rental Fees*:

- Hourly on weekdays (Mon-Thurs):
- \$50/hr (\$35/hr for KGCA Members)
- Hourly on weekends (Fri/Sat/Sun 8am-5pm only):
- \$60/hr (\$50/hr for KGCA Members) *Minimum 4-hour rental required
- Fri, Sat or Sun Full Day (8am-2am):
- \$650 (\$550 for KGCA Members)
- Fri/Sat/Sun Evening only (4pm 2am):
- \$500 (\$400 for KGCA Members)

A mandatory Janitorial Fee is added to most bookings. See "Extra Fees" below. *GST is not included in the above pricing.

Hall Availability

You can check our hall's availability any time by using the on-line calendar at www.killarneyglengarry.com.

Timing

The extra time you need for load-in, set-up, decorating, tear-down, load-out, etc. MUST be included within your booking time - it's not just the timing of the event itself.

Rental Fees

Fees can vary depending on the size & timing of your function & what other services may be required. Once we discuss your event in detail, we can quote a specific & accurate Rental Fee for your booking.

Extra Fees

Mandatory Janitorial & Optional Set-up and/or Teardown Service Fees are \$75 per Service for less than 100 attendees, or \$100 per Service for 100+ attendees.

Deposit & Cancellation

A 50% Deposit is required with the signed contract to secure your booking. This Deposit is fully-refundable (less a \$25 Admin Fee) provided we receive 60 days' or more Cancellation Notice.

Damage Deposit

A Damage Deposit (equal to the Rental Fee) may be reguired, depending on the booking.

Alcohol & Insurance

If alcohol will be on the premises, the Renter is responsible for obtaining an AGLC Liquor Permit & any related Event Insurance.

FACILITIES UPDATE

Killarney Glengarry is very fortunate to be one of the few community associations in Calgary to have a great facility at our disposal. Our hall has character, memories, and history, but with that comes wear and tear - we all get old. The Community Association board has been working hard in the background to try to bring your community space up to snuff with new spaces and amenities for our residents. One major project we are just completing is making the outdoor rink space part of our official lease space. This means that we will be able to install a better rink surface, eventually with boards, better seating (and maybe even a fire pit space). For residents, this means you will be able to book the space for events and that the Community Association will be doing more events like our very well-attended Skate Party of 2017.

One other hot topic right now is carbon credits and energy efficiency. With that in mind we are in the process of upgrading our 100+ year old building to all LED and energy efficient lighting. We have had asked the City of Calgary to perform an audit to see how else we can improve our space while reducing our impact on the environment.




The KGCA Casino Night was a Great Success

Some of the improvements include:


- Change room upgrades


In a number of cultures around the world, the response to a sneeze is typically to wish God would bless the sneezer, or to wish the sneezer health and long life. And the usual responses are to say thank-you or to

excuse oneself for the sneeze.









Imagine Calgary's landscape 1,000 years ago. The indigenous were hunter gatherers on this land. The prairie was bare of trees. People sheltered among the trees and shrubs in the valleys along the Bow and Elbow Rivers where there the trees and plants provided shade, water and berries that protected families from wicked, winter winds. They were strong people for it was a harsh land.

Now think about Calgary. The City of Calgary alone has an inventory of 500,000 trees over 825 square kms in

their care. Gardeners have probably planted as many more. Calgary is now heavily treed and the most expensive real estate usually correlates to the amount of tree canopy. Contrast this with the 2,000,000 trees Singapore has planted in 719 square kms.

Think about it - in Calgary every tree, except those in the river valleys has been planted in the past 140 years by human hands. In March 2017, National Geographic ran a beautiful article on "The Wisdom of Trees." Cathy Newman says, "Every tree tells a story, but some are beyond eloquent, holding memories, embodying belief, marking sorrow. We hold trees in our imagination, where they grow in strange wonderful ways..."

The Gingko is a favourite tree of mine, it isn't known to grow here and is native to Asia, where it is a sacred temple tree. So, pushing the zonal boundaries, I decided to try to grow a Gingko biloba 15 years ago in my inner city garden.

The Gingko is the only living species in the division Ginkgophyta, all others being extinct. It is found in fossils dating back 270 million years! Native to China, the tree is widely cultivated and was introduced early on in human history. It has various uses in traditional medicine and as a source of food. The genus name Ginkgo is regarded as a misspelling of the Japanese gin kyo, or "silver apricot."

The name Gingko biloba is also called the Maidenhair Tree. It is named biloba from the Latin, bis - "two" and loba - "lobed" referring to the shape of the leaves. The tree is popular as a dietary supplement which claims it can enhance cognitive function, although studies have failed to find such effects on the memory or attention in healthy people.

In 2002, I bought a tiny seedling in Vancouver, where they grow in abundance. They rarely suffer disease problems and are attacked by few insects. They are extremely slow growing and are known to live for 2500 years. What a legacy I could leave for Killarney!



This Gingko is called the Child Giving Gingko and is in the courtyard of the Zoshigaya Kishimojin Temple in Tokyo and brings fertility to worshippers. The Gingko leaf is the official symbol of Tokyo \$ the Japanese tea ceremony.



We have a 100-year-old lilac tree on the south side of the house which is on life support. I was looking for a grand tree that would be the successor to the lilac. So, it was the perfect place for the Gingko. It was about 15" high when I planted "him," thinking "he" might survive the wicked winter winds. The spot is sheltered by the fence between two houses. For the first few winters I built a burlap shelter about 18" from the tree on all sides. I did that for about 5 winters and for the past 10 years, the tree has been on "his" own and doing very well - thank you very much!

After all these years, the trunk is still only about 2.5 cms or about an inch in diameter and 5.5' or 165 cms tall. Long after I'm gone I expect this glorious tree, that puts on a spectacular Fall gold display, will be regaling the neighbourhood with stories of days long past.

To my understanding, there have only been two Gingkoes that have survived in Calgary. One at the zoo, which did not survive the winter of 2016/17, and the one on 26 St. in Killarney. If anyone has any information to contradict that, I would love to hear from them. I would encourage all gardeners to give one a try if you have a lovely sheltered spot to help "him" get started.

Working to Improve Road Safety in Killarney

In August, residents from along 29th Street gathered at the Community Hall to discuss safety concerns specific to their street. The discussion included 25 residents, along with Thomas Thivener from Liveable Streets, Councillor Evan Woolley, and Constable Chris McIntosh. A big thank you to Robert Crawley for dropping off flyers to promote the event!

At the discussion, it was determined that there are several issues currently facing 29th street. First and foremost, speeding is an ongoing issue, which in turn leads to several other issues, including the safety of family and playground zones. The group identified that 26th Ave & 29th St, as well as 17th Ave and 29th St, as high-risk areas for collisions. Due to road width, traffic volume, and speeding, parked cars are being hit on either side of the road. Speed bumps are also proving to be ineffective at enforcing the speed limit.

Calgary Police will be enforcing safety by setting up radars along 29th street over the next couple months. The Safe and Vibrant Streets Team will be meeting with the City and Councillor Woolley to further discuss short and long-term solutions in making 29th Street more safe.






Glengarry Park Revitalisation Update
