

MLCA Facility Services Job Posting

The **Facility Services** position is responsible for renting the MLCA upper and lower halls and adjacent kitchens, multipurpose room, volleyball courts and ice rink in accordance with the defined facility rental processes. In addition to renting the facilities, Facility Services will either directly provide, or oversee the provision of rental services to clients. The position is responsible for maintaining a clean and safe environment for hall renters and other facility clients, delivering hall rental services for external or internal clients who require setup, tear down, cleaning or other event services for their event and supporting the MLCA's own programming and event requirements.

This is a full-time role based on 37.5 hours per week. The work schedule is a combination of daytime hours Monday to Friday as well as variable weekend and evening hours as necessary to meet renter needs.

SENIORS IN YOUR COMMUNITY

Seniors Educated by Fire and Laneway Housing Project

After the regular light fitness session with Megan, attendees at the monthly gathering of "Seniors in the Loop" went straight into a long and busy but extremely important agenda.

Shelley Steele, Fire Safety Officer at the City of Calgary rolled out a Fire and Fall Prevention Program for Older Adults called "Remembering When". She provided the group with tips and checklists to ensure the safety of our homes as well as how to plan a home escape in case a fire breaks out.

Shauna Ragust-Smith, Community Relations, AHS complemented the foregoing presentation with information and demonstration on how to prevent and deal with falls.

Professor John Brown who is a professor of architecture at the University of Calgary and the project lead for The Age-in-Place Laneway Housing Research Project, described the project to us and solicited potential test residents for the laneway house prototype in Altadore. For those who are unaware, the project is in its fourth year of development and the first fully-functional prototype will be deployed on the property of a volunteer Altadore resident to conduct the first in a series of three 3 month trials on-site starting in summer 2017. Useful information was also provided to the group by Marianne Wilkat about CAIP Calgary Aging in Place Co-Operative, which provides seniors who remain in their own homes and communities to access the supports they need.

Last month, we talked about how rhyme was so good for little people's brain – this month, here's bit about rhythm... which is different than rhyme. Rhyme is the pattern of words containing similar sounds, while rhythm is simply a beat.

So, why is rhythm important?

Rhythm is literally the heartbeat of a poem, and the cadence and musicality behind the words, the roadwork that brings words and phrases together. Humans have come to expect rhythm in nursery rhymes, poems, songs, rap and other art forms because mirrors the rhythm of the natural world-- day and night, the order of the seasons, the human pulse. And this is satisfying to readers of all ages.

So, at story time, choose books and stories and nursery rhymes that use rhyme and rhythm.

Great rhyming stories

A great start for really little kids are the classic nursery rhymes, like Humpty Dumpty, Hickory Dickory Dock, Little Miss Muffet, Jack and Jill. Because nursery rhymes use patterns and sequence, kids also begin to learn

simple counting skills as they recite, and help kids learn some basic brain skills of recall and memorization. **Great for Growing Brains –**

There are some wonderful, more modern rhyming stories, too, like stories by Australian Mem Fox (some people are better than others at creating successful rhymes for kids!), The Magic Hat, and Ten Little Fingers and Ten Little Toes.

Here're a few more favourites...

- Dr Seuss' Green Eggs and Ham ("That Sam-I-am! That Sam-I-am!...")
- The Owl and the Pussy Cat, by Edward Lear
- The Madeline stories, by Ludwig Bemelsman
- Revolting Rhymes, by Roald Dahl

SUSTAINABILITY – ENERGY LIFE-CYCLE COST

When purchasing a new vehicle or home appliance, you will often come across an EnerGuide label indicating the product energy consumption under standard operating conditions. For instance, a small SUV may have a rated combined fuel consumption of 9.0 liters/100 kms. Based on a \$1.10/liter gas price and total driving of 20,000 kms/year, this vehicle will cost you close to \$2,000 for gasoline every year. Over 5 years, this vehicle will have cost you \$10,500 in gasoline only (assuming a 3% cost escalation for gasoline, and no inflation to simplify things). Had you chosen a more fuel efficiency vehicle, say a Toyota Prius with its combined fuel economy of 4.5 liters/100 kms, your 5-year fuel cost would have been \$5,250. Did you consider this \$5,250 energy saving when you initially selected your vehicle? Would this consideration have impacted your choice? With the current rock bottom gasoline price, and carbon levy that will just go up, these energy cost savings are probably conservative.

The same idea applies to home appliances. For example, a regular top-freezer refrigerator may consume 500 kWh of electricity per year while another same-sized refrigerator that is ENERGY STAR qualified may consume 350 kWh/year. ENERGY STAR is an international symbol managed by the US Department of Energy used to designate premium energy efficient products. At the current total electricity cost of \$0.12/kWh the more energy efficient refrigerator will save approximately 250\$ over it's 15-year life (assuming a conservative 4% cost escalation for electricity). Would you factor in this extra cost of \$250 if you were to decide to buy a non-ENERGY STAR rated refrigerator? The extra cost of non-energy efficient products if often hidden.

When you decide on buying a specific product that uses energy, you also assent to the energy bills accompanying the product. If the energy consumption is minimal, such as for a mobile phone that uses to charge approximately 5 kWh/year, or less than \$0.50/year, this will probably not be a consideration at all. But what about other much larger products? What about homes? Could some homes use way more energy than others? How

can you know how much energy per year your home, or your future home, is likely to consume?

Such energy estimate does exist. The new Energuide Rating System for Homes gives precisely the home expected energy performance under standard operating conditions. With the average Alberta home using 120 GJ of natural gas and 7,200 kWh of electricity every year, and the marginal cost of energy at around \$1,400/home per year, a typical energy efficient home will use half this amount of energy, thus generating savings of \$700/year. Over 40 years, those \$700+ per year savings do make a difference. The type and size of house you buy directly affect your energy bills, and this is reflected in the energy life-cycle cost associated with purchase decisions. When you select an energy-consuming product, whatever it is, you do also pick the long-term energy bills you will pay.

Justice for Albertans

When Judges are in the news condemning policies and demanding action it's typically a bad sign ("Top Alberta judges condemn trial delays, demanding Parliament acts to fill vacancies on the bench," Kaufmann, Calgary Herald, Sept. 28, 2016).

In 2016 one judge in particular – Court of Queen's Bench Chief Justice Neil Wittmann - was blunt in his assessment. Of the previous federal government's treatment of Alberta's justice system he said this:

"The previous federal government wouldn't even authorize the appointment of the number of judges that the Alberta government had, by statute, said they require. In my opinion that is constitutionally impermissible." ("Alberta judge shortage at 'breaking point," Grant, CBC News, Oct. 26, 2016)

In some cases a trial would have a wait time of one or two years before it was event seen by a judge. It's this undermining of a legal system by starving it of resources that underserves Albertans and Calgarians, and has ensuing costs to commerce, jobs, and justice for Canadians.

That's why in 2017 our government is creating 28 new federally-appointed judicial positions, to help address demographic pressures in regions like Alberta and ensure that Canadians have timely access to justice in

Canada – through an investment of \$55.1 million over five years and \$15.1 million per year thereafter, as well as legislative amendments.


This is in addition to the good work that provincial Justice Minister Kathleen Ganley is doing with a recently announced boost in funding, adding new judges to provincial courts, and hiring 50 new Crown prosecutors (and thirty support staff).

All Canadians - no matter their means - should have the right to a fair trial and access to a modern, efficient justice system. We are committed to ensuring that our justice system is fair, relevant and accessible to all Canadians by helping economically disadvantaged people in obtaining legal assistance and representation.

In Budget 2016, we committed to an additional \$88 million over five years for legal aid funding partnerships with the provinces and territories, and today we have announced an additional \$30 million per year in ongoing funding. These new funds will make more legal aid available for those who need it and will support new ways of delivering services. Performance measurement will also be added to make sure legal aid funding is doing what it needs to do.

Our 2015 platform was built for Alberta – by immediately working to ease El rules for those hit by the commodity downturn, investing in carbon pricing to create a consensus to approve (and to soon build) four pipelines to foreign markets, and by working with international partners to open up new markets. I take my role as the cabinet minister from Calgary seriously, in supporting veterans as Minister of Veterans' Affairs, and work every day to make sure that we can continue to build this city.

Budget Town Hall Update

On April 8th, I held a budget town hall. The event was attend by people from all parts of the political spectrum who provided their input on the current state of Alberta's finances. The common theme I heard at the event was that the government is on an unsustainable path and that we cannot continue to go further into debt. Our continued reliance on unpredictable resource revenues means that we will never be able to balance the budget.

Participants were presented with the question of how to increase provincial revenues in order to reduce our reliance on non-renewable resource revenue. When asked how they felt about revenue options, their preferences where ranked in the following order:

- 1. Carbon Tax fully offset by Personal and Corporate Tax reductions and innovation tax credits
- 2. PST with cuts to Personal and Corporate Tax
- 3. New user fees: Toll roads, health care premiums, etc.
- 4. PST on top of other taxes
- 5. Carbon Tax on top of existing taxes
- 6. Increase Corporate Tax
- 7. Increase Personal Tax

I also asked those in attendance to identify where felt they sat on a continuum of budget options from our current deficit path to the sustainable path to cutback path. I overwhelmingly heard people want to find savings in government spending without hurting frontline services. This includes:

- Cap on non-renewable resource revenue used for core programs
- Constrain operational spending by 1%
- Public sector pay freeze
- · Rethink tax system to reward individual effort and increase investment
- Shift to new, sustainable revenue sources to fund core programs

I would like to thank the volunteers and everyone who attended. I appreciated receiving the feedback and would like to hear from all constituents on the issue of our provincial finances. Please feel free to contact



This June marks two years since you promoted me from the shop floor to the Legislature floor as your representative in a government led by Rachel Notley. Every day since, our government has been working hard to implement meaningful policies and programs that provide stability and affordability for Alberta families. In fact, we have fulfilled 73% of our 2015 election platform, with another 15% in the process of being completed this legislative session.

I will be hosting my 2nd annual Stampede Breakfast at the Glenbrook Community Association on Sunday, July 9th – all are welcome! If you want to volunteer by flipping pancakes, let me know.
