We've heard many questions and comments on different developments happening within our established communities and thought we'd share some information on The City's Planning System. In an effort to help make The City of Calgary's planning and development process both more accessible and clearer to citizens, The City has created a new online mapping tool: the Planning and Development Map (PD Map). You can find it online by entering 'PD Map' into the search bar at www. calgary.ca.

With the PD Map, you can track, contact and provide comments on Land Use redesignation proposals and large-scale development permits. Anyone can follow the progress of the file from submission through to decision by City Council. PD Maps is currently in its first phase; additional features will be added, such as the ability to comment on smaller Development Permits which are discretionary or are requesting relaxations. Here are PD Maps current features:

- Multiple Search Options
- Find out what is happening in your community, or in the city. Search by address, community, ward or file number. You can also scroll around the map, apply the Google Maps laver, or roll over a file to highlight the area proposed for development.
- Social Media Sharing
- Share file information on your social media channels to increase community engagement on a file.
- File Status Tracker
- Follow the status of the application from initial to final submission by City Council. Learn about the process and at what times comments can be submitted.
- Direct Comments and Feedback
- · Your comments on a file go directly to the file manager or City Clerk's, depending on what stage the application is at.
- Accessible Online and by Mobile
- Plain Language Descriptions

PD Maps is also tied to another innovative Planning System project, the Notice Posting Pilot. You can find it online by entering 'Notice Posting Pilot' into the search bar at www.calgary.ca.The City has redesigned Notice Postings (signs) so they are larger, more

We Remember

As November 11th approaches, I hope you once again take time to remember those that have sacrificed, those that continue to take on the perilous work of safeguarding Canadian freedoms, and the soldiers who are now representing us abroad as peacekeepers.

It is my honour and pleasure to serve as our nation's Minister of Veterans Affairs. In this role I am entrusted with the mandate to support our veterans – young and old – and in the commemoration of all of Canada's past conflicts.

Just one of the memories that I will be reflecting on this month is the impact of the First World War on Western Canada High School where some 170 Old Boys and 6 Masters had enlisted by 1916. The Calgary Herald estimated some 40% of all the boys who ever attended the college had enlisted and went off to war: and you can see this sacrifice memorialized at the cenotaph today just behind the school. Young men, with their entire futures in front of them, were brought into one of the world's most brutal conflicts and sacrificed themselves our freedoms. It is a story I think of often when I attend ceremonies across this country and serve as Minister of Veterans Affairs.

I invite you to look online on my ministry's website at http://www.veterans.gc.ca/eng/events to see what events are in our community.

The poppy is often worn on the left lapel on a jacket or shirt, and as close to the heart as possible.

Now, it has been nearly a year since I was appointed by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau as a member of his cabinet. In last year's election campaign we promised Canadians a government that would uphold our sacred obligation to veterans.

In Budget 2016 the Government of Canada put \$5.6 bil**lion** additional dollars into Veterans Affairs, showcasing a clear commitment to bettering the lives of our nation's heroes.

This year we have announced the re-openings of the nine Veterans Affairs offices closed by the previous government. In addition to reopening these much needed offices - which support veterans across this country - we are also opening an extra office in Surrey, BC, to support the thousands of veterans who live in that city. Above and beyond this we have increased benefits to veterans by increasing the Earning Loss Benefit to 90% from 75%, increased the Disability Award and are on track to hire up to 400 more frontline staff. With increasing benefits and frontline staff we can better support veterans and make sure they transition smoother into civilian life.

It is in this sacred trust I continue to work to better the lives of veterans and keep the promises we made in the 2015 election.

From the Legislature

By the time you read this the fall sitting of the Alberta Legislature will have started. I expect a fairly busy agenda of government Bills, including two that have carried over from the spring sitting; Bill 21 - Modernized Municipal Government Act and Bill 22 - An Act to Provide for the Repatriation of Indigenous Peoples' Sacred Ceremonial Objects. You can follow the sittings online at www.assembly.ab.ca.

We are also expecting to amend a number of pieces of legislation including the Whistleblower Protection Act, and possibly the Election Finances and Contribution Disclosure Act, as well as some measures to implement the Investor Tax Credit.

This past year I had the honour of serving on the Select Special Ethics and Accountability Committee, an all-party committee tasked with reviewing the core legislation governing Alberta's democratic institutions. While you may have heard that the committee had some challenges, the fact is we worked well together and passed most recommendations unanimously. The one-year mandate of the committee expired in September but my hope is the committee will renewed so we can continue our important work.

While most recommendations passed unanimously, some were passed by the ND government majority. Based on feedback I've heard from my constituents in Calgary-Elbow, I will continue to oppose using taxpayer dollars to rebate a 50% of political party expenses.

Education Curriculum Update

The government has also embarked on an ambitious overhaul of Alberta's K-12 curriculum. The new curriculum will be developed in phases; Kindergarten to Grade 4 will be complete by late 2018, Grades 5 to 8 by late 2019 and high school curriculum will be developed in phases from 2020 to 2022. The current curriculum remains in effect until new curriculum is implemented. More information and an opportunity to provide your feedback into the process is available at www.education.alberta.ca.
