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





PRAYER PLANT

(marantaceae leuconeura erythroneura) Origin: Brazil

In the evening the leaves stand up facing each other, like praying hands, and lay flat during the day.

This is one of my favourite house plants! I love a plant that has something special about it – and this one certainly does.

HOW DOES A PRAYER PLANT PRAY

Circadian rhythm, the change in light from day to night, triggers water to move in and out of the plant cells causing them to fold up at night, hence the name, Prayer Plant.

The most popular are the colourful marantaceae leuconeura erythroneura (Herring bone, Red-nerve plant, Red-veined prayer plant) with its burgundy veined leaves (pictured above), and the green m. leuconeura kerchoviana (Rabbit track).

These plants don't like the cold – so a windowsill in the winter may cause the edges of the leaves to brown. Browning of the leaf edges may also indicate low humidity.

Maranta loves humidity but not wet soil – make sure that your tropical potting mixture has some vermiculite or perlite in it for good drainage.

Feed it every 2 weeks with a 10-10-5 plant food.

Moderate lighting; no direct sunlight for this beauty; otherwise you will notice the color fading from the leaves.

As a matter of fact, most vibrant and colourful foliage does not need direct sunlight at all; rather, pale foliage and variegated houseplants require brighter or direct sunlight to produce photosynthesis.

The secret to success with the Prayer Plant is high humidity.

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January 5 First Quarter (waxing)

Moonlight is strong, encouraging leaf growth. It is a good time for planting, especially two days before the full moon. Take cuttings from plants you wish to propagate. Fertilize as close to the full moon as possible.

January 12 **Full Moon (waning)**

As the moon wanes, the energy is drawing down. Strong gravitational pull but moonlight is decreasing putting energy into the roots.


Last Quarter (waning) January 19

Decreased gravitational pull and moonlight. A resting period. Take cuttings from plants you wish to propagate. Dry herbs, flowers and fruit. If you want to control growth or encourage rooting, perform the necessary activities during the waning moon.

January 27 New Moon (waxing)

Increasing moonlight, lunar gravity pulls water up encouraging plant growth and proliferation. Grafting, transplanting, re-potting, and watering. Gather herbs used for essential oils. Oil content is more concentrated at this time.


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Happy New Year to All!

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

The Woodcreek CA recently announced the stepping down of long time President Cecil (Cec) Jahrig at their last AGM. A huge congratulation goes out to Scott Eden, who has taken over the position of President.

Cec has been President of the Woodcreek Community Association President for 6 years. He has been the heart and soul of the community giving hundreds and hundreds of volunteer hours back since taking over the presidency and serving as Vice President before that.

Cec not only is a Chartered Professional Accountant, but he's also retired from a career in real estate. When the Woodcreek Community Association was in need of a treasurer, Cec was interested in the role. As luck would have it however, six other candidates had also put their names forward for the position. As a result, Cec decided instead to focus on volunteering on the fundraising side for Woodcreek and eventually ran for President.

Cec has seen the CA memberships soar during his time in office with a total of 2401 members since 2010, and 1100 of those members signed up just last year. He has built a great team of volunteers, and without their efforts, the Woodcreek Community Association wouldn't be as successful as it currently stands in serving the residents of Woodbine and Woodlands.

Cec has always been dedicated to recruiting volunteers to organize community and sporting events at the community hall. He is most proud of the support from the entire board and volunteers and has seen a substantial increase in community support throughout the years. Building strong long-lasting relationships have been central to Cec's involvement.

Cec, for all you do and have done for our City, I would like to express a heartfelt thank you on behalf of everyone you serve.

In Cec's owns words:

"Time for a change. At the Woodcreek Community Association Annual General Meeting on Tuesday November 15th I will be stepping down as President and moving into the Past President position. My recommendation for the new President will be Scott Eden who has served as my First Vice President during my term in office. Scott is very active in the community and will do an excellent job.

When I look back at the past 6 ½ years, a lot has happened. Phil Barg was the prime mover in getting the hall addition added and then that is when I took over. Our biggest challenge was to give residents a reason to join the Community Association. Membership had previously been based on sports. If your child wanted to play sports you had to purchase a membership. Sports have left the community and are now club or quadrant based. With the new hall addition, we added furniture, equipment and programs and activities to make it a true community centre. Our community membership in 2010 was 240 and has now risen to 1360 in 2016. Our aim was to give value to becoming a member.

We had a number of interesting challenges over the years. Tsui Tina garbage fire, Shoppers Drug Mart, Skate Board Park, Cell Towers, BRT. Our role was to hold meetings to ensure our residents had the proper information and to give them a chance to express their opinions.

Over the years we have expanded the office, refurbished the board room, added a storage addition, opened 3 downstairs meeting rooms, doubled the garage and repaved the parking lot and upgraded the rink lighting. At our Woodbine sports location we repaved the tennis courts, added pickle ball courts, added a skate board park, paved the ice rink and added a basketball court. All of these improvements were meant to add to the community facilities and to particularly add youth activities.

During my term I have had a very supportive Board of Directors who has done a great job planning, organizing and volunteering. Thanks to them for helping to grow our community and make this a great place to live. We have tremendous support from volunteers in the community and it was a pleasure working with you. Whenever we needed people, they stepped up. The operation of our Community Centre falls to our staff of Linda, Lorraine and Al. They are a dedicated group and it has been a pleasure working with them."
