RKHCA BOARD MESSAGE

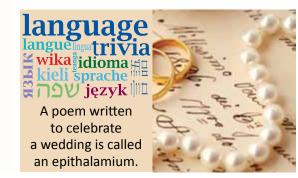
As this is written, we are just coming to the end of the holiday break and preparing to return to school and work and normal routines. For most of us, the last few weeks have been spent out and about in our own community, the greater Calgary area, and for some, visiting other communities near and far away. Each has a unique character, a result of years and decades of planning, development, and change. Generations have come and gone in some instances, or for Richmond Knob Hill, there remain a few original residents and small numbers have lived here for most of their lives.

The Board has begun to reflect on its current slate of activities, and as the community continues to evolve, the strategies on which it should be guided. The community association currently takes on a number of functions, some of which are new, and some very well supported but others not. What is the purpose of a community association in our City and what roles should it perform? How may it execute those roles effectively? Some community associations in Calgary have paid staff, RKHCA does not although it does have contractors for specific activities that generate revenue. The majority of effort is done by volunteers and they cannot do everything that might be of interest to the community. The Board will be reaching out to get input on what you want to see done.

The community association is the City's official contact point for the neighbourhood. City offices, including Transportation, Planning and Development, and others first contact the Board for input to initiatives or feedback on issues. Likewise, the Board can reach out to the City as the official community voice. It can and does represent the concerns of residents to elected representatives as well. The RKHCA is also connected to other community associations to elevate mutual concerns such as development processes and traffic issues.

The community association also serves to build and maintain the social character of the community, as in part of its current motto" "a place to call home". While this includes participating in long term planning activity such as the Crowchild Trail study, it is also about bringing residents together at events such as Winterfest and Face-to-Face Fridays. The community association operates a very good community hall which is very busy with many functions. It also operates two skating rinks and a community garden. We have a web page and social media outlets. There is a newsletter to populate every month. Summer programs have included the very popular TimBits soccer. You participate in community building through actions taken each day that acknowledge being part of RKH. This includes everything from shoveling the snow from the sidewalk in front of your home, to supporting local retailers, and to simply saying "hello" as you pass by a neighbour in the street. However, could you be more involved with your community? Perhaps by taking out a community association membership? By providing the Board feedback on proposed strategies and priorities. Attend the Annual General Meeting in June? Or volunteer for a Board position in the coming year?

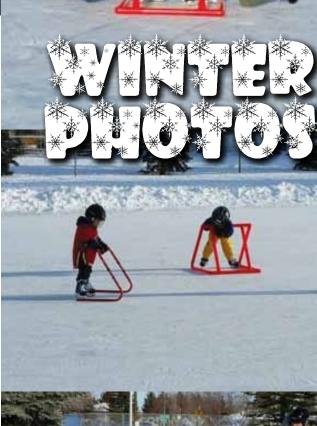

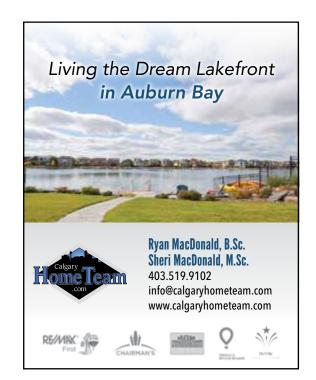

Winter in Calgary is unlike anywhere else in Canada. Bitter cold and blowing snow can be followed up the next day with chinook winds melting it all away. Even with those chinook winds, sometimes winter can get to us.

I find one of the best ways to kick the wintertime blues is to get out in the community and take advantage of some of the snowy weather recreational activities that this city has to offer.

While I like taking advantage of the mountains close by for skiing, with so many community skating rinks scattered throughout Calgary Currie, you don't need to go far to enjoy the benefits of living in such a great place as Calgary.

February is the Heart and Stroke foundation's Heart month. It is important to remember to stay physically active for both our bodies and our minds. The Heart and Stroke Foundation recommends that adults do at least 150 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity per week, in bouts of 10 minutes or more. The activity doesn't have to be non-stop, nor does it need to be strenuous. You can do 10 minutes or more at a time throughout the day to reach your daily total. A brisk 10 minute walk during lunch, playing for 10 minutes with your kids after work, and then another 15 minutes walking your dog in the evening. Five minutes here and there add up to better health.

If you're like me and sometimes like a bit more excitement, there is little that exemplifies the Canadian spirit more than a game of pickup shinny at the outdoor community rink where coming together for community recreation has no need for formal organization. All it takes is people coming together to have fun.

I love the sense of community these rinks bring to our city, and despite my busy schedule with my work at the Legislature in Edmonton, I spend as much time as I can at these meeting places at the heart of our communities. You may have seen me out there over the past couple months warming people up with coffee and hot chocolate, and if you keep your eyes open, you might catch me out there again before the end of skating season.

Housing and Homelessness

At the end of last year I wrote an article for CBC's "Calgary at a Crossroads", in which I expressed my optimism for our city's future as well as my frustration with how we take care of those less fortunate. I said that we have failed on affordable housing and homelessness. With our shelters full and housing too expensive, people sleep out in the cold every night. It's getting worse, and pretty soon we will be too far behind.

I am determined to do what I can as the Councillor for Ward 8 to turn this around. We will need to build a future from our shared dreams and strengths, not our precedents. We will need to embrace the idea of progress and work our asses off in order to achieve it. But this is no easy feat, and it will require all of us to pitch in. Here's how you can help.

Volunteer

There are many organizations across Calgary that care for those who don't have a place to stay, and all of them rely on volunteers. It is not only important for us as citizens to help out where we can, but it is personally enriching and rewarding as well. Serve lunches and suppers, teach a child to read, assist with special events. There are a number of groups you can approach, but aside from the obvious four (The Mustard Seed, The Drop-In Centre, Inn from the Cold, and Alpha House) a good start is the Calgary Homeless Foundation's list of all agencies they fund – visit calgaryhomeless.com.

Donate

Donate your used clothes, purses, backpacks, bedding, curtains, towels and shoes at locations all around Calgary. An easy way to find out where to go is to contact the Alberta Recycling Hotline: call 1-800-463-6326 or visit recyclinghotline.ca.

Make Your Voice Heard

To solve the complex issues of affordable housing and homelessness, we need new energy and fresh ideas. We need you to speak up and speak out, and join the conversation about how we can end homelessness instead of just bandage it day after day, year after year. Write me. Join your community association. Reach out to those who live on the street, or in a shelter, or in affordable housing. Help build inclusive communities and a compassionate city – it all starts with you and your voice.

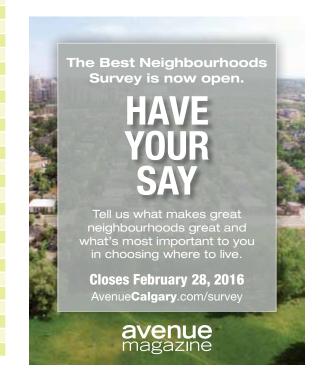

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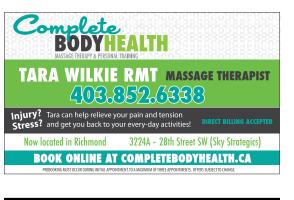


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
