### DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE UPDATE

#### ML33 Appeal Update

The RKHCA's appeal of the approval of a development permit (DP) for a 5-storey, 135 unit ML33 condo development at 2418 33 AV SW was heard by the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (SDAB) on November 15. At the end of the hearing, which lasted all day, the SDAB announced that our appeal would be allowed in part and that the DP would be issued but with additional conditions attached, which additional conditions would be outlined in their written decision to be issued in due course.

At the time of writing this article (early December) the SDAB had not vet issued its written decision, so we still do not know what additional conditions the SDAB will add to the DP. Hopefully the additional conditions will not merely be minor ones (eq. replace the Siberian Larches with a different type of coniferous tree that does not lose its foliage in winter), but rather will address at least some, if not all, of the primary concerns that we raised regarding density, mass, overshadowing, public realm, traffic, etc. As we indicated in earlier articles, this appeal is the first real test of the Marda Loop Area Redevelopment Plan (ARP) that was approved by City Council back in 2014, and should give us a good indication of whether the ARP has "teeth", or whether it is little more than a pie-in-the-sky vision that developers are free to follow or not.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank those RKH residents who engaged on this proposed development by attending the Open Houses that were held back in 2015, filling out questionnaires, submitting letters, and attending the SDAB hearing. RKH is in the process of transforming from a 1950s bungalow community to a modern urban community, and it is great to see residents getting involved in that transformation process and sharing their views on the type of community they would like RKH to become.

Stay tuned for a further update once the SDAB decision has been issued.

## RKHCA Solar Roof Project Update

The RKHCA Solar Roof Project is now complete and RKHCA is generating its own electricity!

The project involved the replacement of the Community Hall's aging asphalt shingle roof with a new standing seam metal roof, followed by the installation of a 10mW solar panel array on the Hall's SE-facing and SW-facing roof surfaces. In addition to looking great and having a long life expectancy, the standing seam metal roof has the added benefits of allowing the solar panel system to be installed without any need to penetrate the roof membrane, as well as providing a much better surface for capturing rainwater for the adjacent Community Garden.

The 10mW solar panel array is expected to generate 100% of the Community Centre's electrical needs, including the Hall, the Skate Shack and the rink lights. The solar system is grid-tied with a 2-way meter, which means that during those times when the system is generating more electricity than the Community Centre is using the excess electricity generated will be fed back into the City's electrical grid in exchange for credits, which credits will then be applied during those times when the Community Centre is consuming more electricity than the system is generating.

We would like to give a great big shout-out to:

- the federal government's Canada 150 Community Infrastructure program, which provide us with a grant that made the entire project possible by covering a significant portion of the project cost;
- Epic Roofing & Exteriors, who supported the project by giving us a great deal on the standing seam metal roof, and then by doing a great job of installing it within a tight timeframe;
- 3. SkyFire Energy Solar Energy Systems, who emerged as the clear winner of the RFP process that we undertook last winter, stuck with us patiently through 2016 as roofing and structural issues were resolved, and then in the blink of an eye installed a great so-

lar panel array that will cover our electrical needs for many years to come; and

4. the City of Calgary's Sustainable Infrastructure and Neighbourhood Services groups, who helped us stickhandle the project through to completion.

Stay tuned for opportunities to find out more about the solar panel array, and for a planned event later this year to celebrate both the completion of the project and Canada's 150th Anniversary!

### **EMS: Sledding Safety**

Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and children of some basic sledding safety tips as the winter season continues. Sledding injuries can result from collisions with stationary objects, such as trees and rocks, or with other people on the hill. Unprotected falls can result in injury if you lose control at high speeds. Everyone is at risk – especially children. Have a fun and safe trip on the toboggan hill by following these simple reminders:

### Equipment

- Always ensure your toboggan or sledding device is in good repair. Inspect it for any damage, or missing parts before each use;
- Be certain the operator is fully capable of staying in control of the sled at all times;
- Children should wear a properly fitted helmet designed for other high impact sports such as hockey, cycling, or climbing.

### Plan ahead

- Dress warmly in layers and anticipate weather changes;
  Consider bringing extra sets of gloves and toques to
- exchange wet garments for dry ones;
- Take breaks to warm up out of the cold;
- · Attempt to cover exposed skin from the elements;
- Even when properly protected from the elements, the finger tips, toes, ears, the tip of the nose, and other high points on the face such as the forehead and cheeks may be affected by the cold;
- If a cold-related emergency has occurred, treat it by first removing the individual from of the environment;
  Gently warm the affected skin by placing a warm hand
- over it or by placing the affected part in warm water (~41°C max.) until re-warmed.

### Hazards

- Avoid hills that are too steep, or too icy you can lose control very quickly;
- Choose hills free of all obstacles such as trees, rocks, utility poles, or fences;
- Beware of loose clothing (i.e. scarves), or clothing containing drawstrings which can present a choking hazard if they become caught or snagged.

Do you find yourself shaking your head as you see drivers speeding along your street? Pedestrians repeatedly unable to cross the street safely or riding your bike feel like you're a target for other moving vehicles? Have you felt helpless, shrugged your shoulders and figured there is nothing that you can do?

Well, you're not alone but there are some steps to take to improving the situation. First, identify if there are specific times or dates that the incidents occur. Speak to neighbours to see if others share you concern. If so, then complete an online TRAFFIC SERVICE REQUEST (TSR) http://www.calgary.ca/cps/Pages/Traffic/Trafficreporting.aspx and ask others with similar observations to fill them too.

If you feel the need to speak with the police, call the TSR line (403-567-4029) to discuss the matter unless of course it an emergency. To escalate the matter with the City of Calgary, collect signatures from your neighbours to validate the concern (use the forms from

http://www.calgary.ca/Transportation/TP/Documents/ transportation\_solutions/traffic-calming-policy.pdf). Depending on the nature of the concern (ie. Speeding) then Calgary Police may dispatch photo radar to verify the problem.

Finally, contact the Richmond Knob Community Association (traffic@richmondknobhill.ca) if you haven't done so already, to finalize your submission to the City. At any time, feel free to contact RKHCA to let us know your concerns because what we don't know, we can't do much about and we can provide guidance on how to complete the submission.

Now, wouldn't it just be simpler if everyone remembered that our neighbourhood streets are not highways and lead to the places where our hearts live. Excessive speed and inattention are proven to have fatal consequences so why not drive a little slower and focus on that task- safer streets are in all of our hands.

But, I'm also aware that while we've done a great job in serving people experiencing homelessness we still don't have enough appropriate housing for our vulnerable citizens. #### Approving, and Building, Energy Projects

As Prime Minister Justin Trudeau wrote in his mandate letter to my colleague Natural Resources Minister James Carr: "it is a core responsibility of the federal government to help get our natural resources to market..." It is a clear direction, by both this government and yours truly, to gain access to tidewater for Alberta's products and to exporting energy abroad, and was why we approved both Trans Mountain and Line 3 on November 29<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

However, as the Prime Minister has emphasized time and time again, the only way to get resources to market in the twenty-first century is if they are done sustainably and **responsibly**. The environment and the economy are two sides of the same coin, and it is not possible to achieve long term economic success without having the trust of the Canadian people, support by Indigenous Peoples', and allaying local concerns.

This is why we are working with the provinces and territories to develop a Canadian Energy Strategy. It's why our government has committed \$1.5 billion over the next five years to have a world-leading Oceans Protection Plan to safeguard our coasts and invest in the transportation corridors that gain access for all of Canada's products abroad.

It's why our government is moving forward with putting a price on carbon pollution, which will give us a competitive edge internationally and incent the marketplace to innovate to build a clean-growth economy. This will also have the additional effect of safeguarding Canadian's health and clean air, and bring new and exciting job prospects for middle-class Canadians.

It's why, in the fall of 2016, our government approved Pacific Northwest. This project has an estimated total capital investment of up to \$36 billion and is one of Canada's largest resource development projects. This project will provide some 4,500 middle class jobs during construction and 630 indirect/direct jobs during its operation.

It's why we are ensuring the environmental risks linked to development are addressed by industry before projects proceed. The Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency took in a ground-breaking 34,000 comments from the public, and was granted a three-month extension to the timeline to ensure we had the science right. Northwest will be required to comply with specific mitigation measures that will minimize adverse effects on fish habitat, wetlands, human health, and on Indigenous peoples. And for the first time ever, annual greenhouse gas emissions for the project have been capped at a maximum level that is substantially lower than initially envisaged for the project.

These decisions reflect our promise to work with provinces, indigenous peoples and Canadians to find practical solutions that will grow our economy, create good jobs and protect our environment for future generations.

I've seen some exciting initiatives in Currie, such as the Richmond Knob Hill Community Association building recently installing solar roof panels. In our own homes, we can use plastic window insulation, carpool more with our neighbours, take advantage of our cycle paths, or take public transit, as I know many of you already do.

Whatever you chose to do, it's your Alberta, your environment. Let's start the new year off with moving our province forward toward a cleaner future.


