



Calgary's Main Streets are the cultural, social and economic focal point of a community. As the heart of the community, a Main Street is vibrant by design. Main Streets capture the character of a community by being inviting, safe, attractive, and memorable. They are places where people in a community can live and come together to enjoy a number of activities.

Your community's Main Streets underwent the "design" step of the Main Streets program in 2018 and 2019. This step created streetscape master plans that focuses on safe, comfortable, and improved public realm environments that expand on the surrounding communities' character.

These plans were a community-driven effort that linked the priorities of community residents, business owners, and The City's urban design and transportation policies and priorities.

33 and 34 Avenues S.W.


The streetscape master plan was approved by City Council in May 2019 and is partially funded for construction. A new BRT station at Crowchild Trail is under construction and is expected to be completed in late 2019. The City will improve the connections between the BRT station and 32 and 33 Avenues through sidewalk and lighting improvements. Construction of sections of the streetscape master plan will be undertaken in phases, with the first phase slated to begin in 2021. Timing, scope and boundaries of phases will be determined through technical analysis and engagement with local business owners and residents.

17 Avenue S.W. and 37 Street S.W.

These two streetscape master plans were approved in Fall 2019 and are fully funded for construction beginning next year. The City of Calgary Main Streets team is currently developing a detailed design for each Main Street and undertaking technical analysis.

The Main Streets team is committed to keeping your community in the loop as projects progress towards construction and beyond. We'll be holding an information session early in 2020 to provide more details regarding the 17 Avenue and 37 Street Main Street designs and construction process. 


The Olde 'p' Letter

Richmond School has heart!

RASCAL OF THE MONTH



Before our 2019 RKH Rascal Family Album is complete, we have one more pooch to meet –Lucy. Lucy (also known as Silly Turkey Face, Silly Good Girl, Mrs. Too Cute, and Princess Poochie), is a 9-year-old Rottweiler/Rhodesian Ridgeback cross who is often mistaken for a German Shepard puppy on her walks, even though she is almost able to access her senior citizen discount without showing ID. Lucy's human friends would describe her as a classy gal who knows what she wants and how to get it!

On her walkies throughout the last 5 years, you may have seen Lucy being walked with a harness or cart. In early 2016, Lucy had a life-threatening spinal injury that left her rear limbs completely paralyzed. Her injury required emergency spinal surgery and it was about 4 months before she was able to walk on her own again. Lucy was a dedicated (but sometimes ornery!) patient when attending physiotherapy sessions at Western Veterinary Centre, where she quickly became a loved member of their family and was able to regain her hind-limb and tail mobility. At her appointments, Lucy got tons of treats, massage, acupuncture, and water workouts, which explains why Lucy often confused her visits to physio with a visit to the spa.

Before Lucy's injury, she loved to go hiking, running, and cross-country skiing with her family. Now that she is retired from the enduro-mountain life, Lucy likes to spend her time surveying the backyard, getting fussed over by her neighbor, Steve, and learning new tricks that involve chicken and liver treats. Even though her family has provided her with a custom-built ramp to get up and down the deck stairs (Lucy can't do stairs well since her injury), a heated/insulated dog house and two plush, waterproof, outdoor beds, Lucy prefers to use her survivalist skills and lay in muddy holes she's dug under her ramp.

While Lucy wouldn't say it herself, her family would like all RKH dog families to know that they apologize for Lucy's generally rude behaviour towards other dogs on her walkies. Because Lucy's injury makes her feel more vulnerable, she often expresses her fear as defensive barking, which is why if you see Lucy out with her family while you're walking your dog, she and her family might be hiding behind a car until you pass - they'd like you to know that it's not you, it's her and they appreciate your patience and understanding!


