




Theft Prevention in your Community: Recyclable Containers

Theft of recyclable/refundable items, such as bottles and cans, continues to be a concern for many Calgary communities. To prevent your home or property from becoming a target for thieves, the Calgary Police Service offers the following tips:

- Take refundable containers such as pop cans and milk jugs to bottle depots. Refundable containers left in blue carts encourage people to go through the contents, which can lead to littering and vandalism.
 Refundable containers left out and accessible may also attract bottle pickers to your community.
- Do not leave refundable containers unattended in your backyard. These items offer a target for thieves who may enter your property.
- Lock refundable containers in your home or garage.
 Lock any gates with access to your property to deter
- unwanted individuals from entering.
- If you don't find recycling depots convenient, you may also consider donating your refundable containers to local bottle drives, or simply dropping the containers off at a bottle depot. Many depots have a bin for donations and the money collected goes to charitable organizations.

If you notice your recyclables have been taken from your backyard without your consent, contact the police non-emergency line at 403-266-1234 or report online via www.calgarypolice.ca. If you see a prowler outside your home, call 9-1-1 immediately.

Summer has arrived! The month of July has a lot to look forward to, such as our annual Payne-cake Breakfast, Calgary Stampede, Calgary Folk Music Festival, Calgary International Blues Festival and much more. This year our Payne-cake Breakfast will be held on July 15 from 9-11 am at In-Definite Arts, #2-8038 Fairmount Dr SE. This is a great opportunity to meet community members and your local MLA.

Our government wrapped up a busy legislative session in early June. In particular, I'm proud that our government passed Bill 17: The Fair and Family-friendly Workplaces Act. All Albertans deserve to be treated fairly at work. Albertans deserve fair and family-friendly workplace laws that support a strong economy and ensure

Monthly Incentives on Financing & Leasing

SSS Receive a bonus cash incentive for all referrals resulting in a sale that they can take care of their families, while helping businesses stay competitive.

These amendments ensure Albertans can go to work and contribute to our economy while still being able to care for themselves and their families. Parents of critically ill or injured children can take time off to care for their child without fear of losing their job. The Act also creates unpaid bereavement leave and sick leave for all Alberta workers, and lowers the eligibility threshold for maternity leave.

Alberta's labour laws had not been significantly updated since the late 1980s, but workplaces have changed a lot in the past 30 years. The new rules are modern, fair, and balance the needs of both employers and employees. Balancing these interests will contribute to a strong economy by ensuring that businesses are on a level playing field and competitive, not just within Alberta but across Canada.

These changes are expected to come into effect in January 2018, and I truly believe they will make life better for Albertans.

In other news, the Alberta Electoral Boundaries Commission has released its interim report with proposed boundary changes to address the changing population of Calgary and our province as a whole. By law, a review is done every 10 years to ensure that the population and geographic distribution of the ridings is fair and equitable.

You can view the interim report and provide feedback by going to http://abebc.ca. You can also register to present to the Commission during its upcoming July 20 Public Hearing in Calgary at the same website.

Of the communities in Calgary–Acadia, most are proposed to remain in the riding, while Riverbend is proposed to be added to Calgary-Peigan. The communities of Canyon Meadows, Haysboro, Chinook Park, and Kingsland would be added to Calgary–Acadia to support the changing population of these communities.

Dear Constituents:

I hope all of you are enjoying the summer with family and friends while celebrating the 150th anniversary of Canada and Calgary Stampede. I would like to wish you all Happy Canada Day and Happy Stampede!

The spring session at Alberta's Legislative Assembly finished in June, and now I am excitedly looking forward to engaging with you all through various community stampede breakfasts, events and meetings.

Recent Updates:

1) Employer Liaison Service Pilot:

The pilot project will support **employment** in Alberta by working with Alberta employers and connecting them with Albertans who have been displaced by the economic downturn and/or changes in the nature of work (automation, technological advancements and temporary employment contracts).

This service will help connect employers with unemployed workers and workers from untapped labour pools: Indigenous peoples, recent immigrants, persons with disabilities and youth.

The initial focus of this project is on employers impacted by the new Temporary Foreign Worker Program's "Refusal to Process" list which identifies 29 "high-wage" occupations for which there is a sufficient supply of Albertans who are skilled in these occupations and looking for work.

A dedicated landing page will be developed on *AlbertaCanada.com*. Employers will be directed to this page which will house information and resources to help those impacted by the Refusal to Process list. Some of those resources will include:

- labour market programs and services;
- recruitment options for connecting with underrepresented groups in Alberta;
- labour market information; and

• A sign-up to Alberta Workforce Information email service. Alberta Labour works with employers to connect them to the Canada-Alberta Job Bank subscription service, which provides information and resources regarding recruitment and retention.

Alberta's government is helping employers to hire locally first through this program. The service will provide en-

hanced, proactive support services to employers impacted by the "Refusal to Process" list and help connect them with options for recruiting locally available workers.

2) Employment Standards Code and Labour Relations Code Amendments:

Alberta's government updated the Alberta workplace laws as they were not revised since 1988. These amendments will make life better for Alberta families by supporting family-friendly workplaces and protecting vulnerable Albertans who rely on the basic protections and rights enshrined in law. This means:

- Ensuring parents of critically-ill or injured children can take time off to care for their family without the fear of losing their job.
- Allowing Albertans the time they need to care for themselves when they're dealing with a short-term illness or mourning the loss of a loved one.
- Lowering the eligibility threshold for maternity leave so hardworking women can support themselves and their families.
- Strengthening our enforcement tools to ensure all employers follow the law and help Albertans receive the pay and benefits they're rightfully entitled to.




