

The Red Crossbill is a stocky finch with a heavy head and a short, notched tail. Males are reddish-scarlet or reddish-yellow except for their dark wings and tail while females are olive-grey to greenish yellow with plain dark wings. This songbird is common in the mountain and foothills regions of Alberta year round and it is considered a global species. The Red Crossbill's range is hard to define and its population is hard to monitor because their movements are irregular and based on food availability.

Fun Facts:


- The tips of its large bill are crossed; an adaptation for removing seeds from tight closed cones.
- The Red Crossbill's biting muscles are stronger than the muscles to open the bill so it places the tips of its slightly open bill under a cone scale and then bites down.
- You can spot this songbird by their undulating (wavelike) flight, which is even noticeable when they are flying at great heights
- Red Crossbills are considered irregular breeders because they can breed whenever and wherever they can find a large crop of cones, even during the winter
 Because of this irregular breeding, the timeframes for the Red Crossbill's lifecycle varies more than most North American songbirds. For example, juveniles hatched during the summer molt only once (between late summer and late autumn) whereas juveniles hatched from late winter to early spring molt twice (about three and a half months after hatching and again during the main summer molt period).
- Because of their dependence on food supply, Red Crossbills may occupy an area in huge numbers and then disappear for long periods of time (this behaviour can sometimes be called 'irruptive')
- These birds can often be heard but rarely do they make themselves visible



Use Less Plastic Today... And Tomorrow

Using plastic products has become common place in our coming-and-going these days. Recycling can alleviate some of the strain on the environment caused by waste but certainly not all of it. According to the Green Education Foundation, of the 30 million tons of plastic waste generated in the US in 2009, only 7 per cent was recycled. Making changes to your daily routine can lead to peace of mind and healthier lifestyle habits too. Here are 17 ways to make your environmental footprint a little less heavy:

- Plastic straws are a big contributor to daily waste. Consider buying a stainless steel or glass straw or forgo using one at all.
- 2. Many cities have banned one-use plastic bags; a single plastic bag can take 1,000 years to degrade. Use a reusable shopping bag; there are many tutorials for making your own out of everyday items too.
- 3. Put gum on your "plastics-to-give-up" list. Chewing gum is made of synthetic rubber—otherwise known as plastic. Ew!
- 4. Purchase products in boxes instead of plastic bottles and containers. Cardboard is less taxing to degrade and recycle.
- Buy in bulk. Fill up your reusable bag or container and save money while you save yourself recycling duty.
- 6. Reuse containers for storing leftovers, knickknacks, kitchen ingredients, small toys and shopping in bulk.
- 7. Carry your reusable bottle or mug with you and use for your beverages on the go.
- 8. Bring your own container for takeout or your restaurant doggy-bag. Many places use Styrofoam, let



them know you don't want it beforehand. There are great stainless steel alternatives available.

- 9. Instead of using a plastic lighter, stock up on matches or use a refillable metal lighter.
- 10. If you avoid frozen food, you'll avoid far more plastics as well, and, as a bonus, you'll eat less processed foods.
- 11. Avoid using disposable plastic-ware at home and request that restaurants not pack it in your takeout.
- 12. Often if you shop at a smaller market or a farmers' market vendors will allow you to reuse containers for berries and tomatoes and such. Ask!
- 13. Diapers are one of the worst offenders when it comes to plastic waste. The EPA estimates that 7.6 billion pounds of disposable diapers are discarded in the US every year. Use cloth diapers; there are many cloth diaper services available to clean up after baby.
- 14. Make fresh juices or eat fruit instead of buying bottled juices. It's better for you as well.
- 15. Making your own cleaning products is surprisingly simple, effective and thrifty. It can be as simple as lemon juice and white vinegar. Kid friendly, too!
- 16. Pack your lunch in reusable containers and bags, and avoid products that are single serving.
- 17. Use a razor with replaceable blades instead of disposable, there are fun companies that you can pay a flat fee to who will send you replacements every month.



Learn more about your Calgary Catholic School District Board of Trustees!

Calgary Catholic School District (CCSD) has seven trustees that work together for the whole district, with each representing wards in Calgary and the surrounding area. Cheryl Low is currently serving as board chair and Margaret Belcourt is our vice-chair. The Board of Trustees sets the direction of the school district through governance. It is the role of trustees to lead with inclusion; to understand the needs of our community; to be informed in our decision-making; and to serve our stakeholders by providing an opportunity for success for each and every student.

School councils are an important communication link to the Board of Trustees, as they represent school communities throughout the district. Councils are established in all schools and serve as a vehicle for parents/legal guardians, principals and teachers to meet and work together towards common goals – resulting in a more vibrant and effective school community. All parents/legal guardians with students attending school are members of their local school council and are encouraged to participate in council activities.

Parent and Trustee Forums are held annually in November, January and March. More information can be found on the CCSD website (www.cssd.ab.ca) under Parents/School Council. These forums provide an opportunity for the Board of Trustees to meet with parents, to share information and to gain valuable insights that support board decision-making and advocacy for our students. Topics range from budget and district priorities to current issues such as international travel, the Modernized Municipal Government Act (MMGA) and City Charters.

The Board of Trustees recognizes the importance of parental voice in education and provides a district membership to Alberta School Councils Association (ASCA). ASCA is the provincial association representing parents on school council and brings the parental perspective to government and education organizations in Alberta.

Trustees rely on school councils to bring them critical perspectives about education, an individual school's needs and community concerns. Each school council brings a distinct voice and broad representation to the dialogue on education. Through this engagement, the Board of Trustees can share information and gain valuable insights that support board decision-making and advocacy for our students. Nurturing a sense of belonging on National Child Day Nov. 20

National Child Day is celebrated annually to mark two historic events: the 1959 signing by Canada of the United Nations Conventions on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and the adoption of the convention.

This year's theme is a young person's right to belong.

Identity and belonging is about young people developing a positive sense of who they are, and feeling that they are valued and respected as part of a family and community. Positive messages about their families, backgrounds, cultures, beliefs, and languages help children learn, develop skills and a healthy sense of identity and belonging; this helps them later to better deal with bullying and discrimination.

One way your family can celebrate National Child Day is to share a book or story about belonging.

It's Okay To "Double-Dip"

Key Points:

- When we say double-dip, we mean using the tax refund from your RRSP contribution to make an RESP contribution.
- Take advantage of the CESG program, which provides grant money for contributions made for an eligible child.
 Consider monthly Pre-Authorization Contributions instead of annual contributions toward your RRSPs.

Help secure your family's future

As a parent, you have to be a terrific juggler. You juggle time to complete all the tasks and chores that fill your day. You juggle responsibilities to ensure your children have the best possible childhood and prospects for their future. Yet the toughest juggling act of all is managing your finances while raising a family. It can be even more difficult to find the extra dollars needed to invest towards a comfortable financial future, including your retirement and the educational plans of your children.

If you're a parent of young children, you are probably struggling with a tough decision: Is it better to first save for your retirement through registered retirement savings plans (RRSPs), or to save for your children's education through registered education savings plans (RESPs)?

Fret no more because there is a way to do both: Make your RRSP contribution before the deadline each year and use the resulting tax refund to make an RESP contribution. That's the ultimate "double-dip" because your child's RESP can also take advantage of "free" cash from the federal government in the form of a Canada Education Savings Grant (CESG).

Here's why the ultimate "double-dip" works so well:

- When you make your maximum allowable RRSP contribution, you may enjoy tax savings that can be applied towards establishing or adding to your children's RESPs.
- The federal government's CESG program provides a matching grant for each RESP contribution made for an eligible child. The Basic CESG is worth 20 per cent on the first \$2,500 of an annual RESP contribution or \$500 per year. This eligibility accumulates and carries forward, so even if you were unable to make enough of an RESP contribution to access the full Basic CESG money in previous years, you can start to make up for it now and in future years and get the Basic CESG money your child would have received in those earlier years.

We Remember

As November 11th approaches, I hope you once again take time to remember those that have sacrificed, those that continue to take on the perilous work of safeguarding Canadian freedoms, and the soldiers who are now representing us abroad as peacekeepers.

It is my honour and pleasure to serve as our nation's Minister of Veterans Affairs. In this role I am entrusted with the mandate to support our veterans - young and old - and in the commemoration of all of Canada's past conflicts.

Just one of the memories that I will be reflecting on this month is the impact of the First World War on Western Canada High School where some 170 Old Boys and 6 Masters had enlisted by 1916. The Calgary Herald estimated some 40% of all the boys who ever attended the college had enlisted and went off to war: and you can see this sacrifice memorialized at the cenotaph today just behind the school. Young men, with their entire futures in front of them, were brought into one of the world's most brutal conflicts and sacrificed themselves our freedoms. It is a story I think of often when I attend ceremonies across this country and serve as Minister of Veterans Affairs.

Now, it has been nearly a year since I was appointed by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau as a member of his cabinet. In last year's election campaign we promised Canadians a government that would uphold our sacred obligation to veterans.

In Budget 2016 the Government of Canada put \$5.6 billion additional dollars into Veterans Affairs, showcasing a clear commitment to bettering the lives of our nation's heroes.

This year we have announced the re-openings of the nine Veterans Affairs offices closed by the previous government. In addition to reopening these much needed offices - which support veterans across this country - we are also opening an extra office in Surrey, BC, to support the thousands of veterans who live in that city. Above and beyond this we have increased benefits to veterans by increasing the Earning Loss Benefit to 90% from 75%, increased the Disability Award and are on track to hire up to 400 more frontline staff. With increasing benefits and frontline staff we can better support veterans and make sure they transition smoother into civilian life.

It is in this sacred trust I continue to work to better the lives of veterans and keep the promises we made in the 2015 election.

The second sitting of the 29th Legislature reconvened on October 31st, 2016 and it was my pleasure to represent the constituents of Calgary-Buffalo there. This session the Legislature will be discussing how our government can strengthen the economy, ensure stability in service-delivery, and make Alberta one of the most environmentally-responsible energy producers in the world. Acting on the recommendations put forward by the Climate Change Advisory Panel, Alberta introduced the Climate Leadership Plan in November of 2015. The Plan includes a series of actions that will roll out beginning January 2017.

Government is addressing climate change because it directly affects our health, environment and the economy of the province. For too long the reputation of our energy industry has been damaged by outdated policies that have hurt our access to new markets. By address climate change head-on, Alberta is repositioning itself as a forward-looking energy producer. There are four core aspects of the Climate Leadership Plan:

- 1. An accelerated phase out of coal-powered electricity. The Canadian Association of Physicians for the Environment estimates that pollution from coal-fired power is responsible for million in annual health care costs. Government is accelerating the phase-out to reduce needless hospital admissions, premature deaths, and emergency room visits.
- 2. Transitioning to a system where one-third of coalfired generation is replaced by natural gas generators, and two-thirds by renewable energy.
- 3. An economy-wide price on carbon pollution of \$30/ tonne that while be phased in beginning January 2017. Alberta's carbon levy will reward families, businesses and communities that take steps to lower their emissions. The levy will also diversify our energy industry and create new jobs, with carbon rebates introduced to offset the costs associated with the levy to help low and middle-income households adjust. Every dollar will be put to work in Alberta, or returned to Albertans.

4. A 100 megatonne (Mt) annual limit on oilsands emissions (currently at roughly 70 Mt). The Climate Leadership Plan has been endorsed by major industry players including CNRL, Shell, Suncor and Cenovus. By showing leadership to protect our health, environment and the economy for future generations, we will improve Alberta's reputation and access to new markets.

From the Legislature

By the time you read this the fall sitting of the Alberta Legislature will have started. I expect a fairly busy agenda of government Bills, including two that have carried over from the spring sitting; Bill 21 - Modernized Municipal Government Act and Bill 22 - An Act to Provide for the Repatriation of Indigenous Peoples' Sacred Ceremonial Objects. We are also expecting to amend a number of pieces of legislation including the Whistleblower Protection Act, and possibly the Election Finances and Contribution Disclosure Act, as well as some measures to implement the Investor Tax Credit.

This past year I had the honour of serving on the Select Special Ethics and Accountability Committee, an all-party committee tasked with reviewing the core legislation governing Alberta's democratic institutions. While you may have heard that the committee had some challenges, the fact is we worked well together and passed most recommendations unanimously. The one-year mandate of the committee expired in September but my hope is the committee will renewed so we can continue our important work.

While most recommendations passed unanimously, some were passed by the ND government majority. Based on feedback I've heard from my constituents in Calgary-Elbow, I will continue to oppose using taxpayer dollars to rebate a 50% of political party expenses.

Education Curriculum Update

The government has also embarked on an ambitious overhaul of Alberta's K-12 curriculum. The new curriculum will be developed in phases; Kindergarten to Grade 4 will be complete by late 2018, Grades 5 to 8 by late 2019 and high school curriculum will be developed in phases from 2020 to 2022. The current curriculum remains in effect until new curriculum is implemented. More information and an opportunity to provide your feedback into the process is available at www.education.alberta.ca.

Snow and Ice Control

We know how to do winter in Calgary, and when it comes to clearing the snow and ice from our roads and pathways, we're getting better all the time. Throughout the winter months and especially after a big dump of snow, Calgary Roads has crews available around the clock to sand, salt and plow. Here's how it works:

Before the Snow Falls

Even before it snows, City crews are busy anti-icing roadways to reduce the accumulation of ice and snow on the roads. A Road Salt Management Plan is followed to improve environmental protection without compromising road safety. The City also uses snow fences as part of the annual winter road maintenance program. Over 140 strategically placed snow fences reduce the build-up of drifting snow and ice on roads, and help to keep winter roads safe by improving visibility for motorists.

During and After the Snow Falls

The City sands, salts, and plows roads and select sidewalks based on a priority system, and all work is to be completed within seven days from the point a snowfall ends. Within 24 hours of the end of a snowfall, major roadways (Priority 1) with traffic volumes over 20,000 vehicles per day are completely plowed, sanded and salted. A Snow Route Parking Ban may also be declared during this time - visit www.calgary.ca to find out. Within 48 hours, all Priority 2 roadways are completed; this includes bus routes, problem areas and roads that carry over 5,000 vehicles per day. Work then continues on Priority 3 and 4 roadways, focusing on designated hills and slower speed zones, and eventually moving on to sidewalks and pathways.

What You Can Do

The City of Calgary has a very sophisticated Snow and Ice Control program, and it does great work every year, but residents need to pitch in as well.

- When you drive in the winter, don't fool around: get winter tires.
- When you cycle in the winter, perform regular maintenance on your bike.
- When you walk in the winter, wear shoes with good grip.

· Homeowners are responsible for removing snow and ice from parking spaces, driveways and sidewalks. • Be patient, and let the City follow the Seven Day Snow Event Plan. If something isn't right, however, report it to 3-1-1.

· Drive, cycle and walk safely. Give yourself extra time, don't rush, and be courteous to others.


