PAST PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2016 AGM

I would like to thank you for coming out and taking part in our Annual General Meeting. Hopefully this AGM will be a little quieter and more productive than our last years meeting.

My report will cover what has happened in the community this past year and you will elect a new Board of Directors to take us through the coming year. Our Community Association year runs from Sept. 1 to Aug. 31.

As per the agenda, I will cover several sections in my report.

BUILDING AND GROUND IMPROVEMENTS Signage

We did some painting on the Woodlands sign on Woodpark Blvd. and after 35 years we finally have a Woodbine sign on 24th Street.

Basement improvements

This was where our major improvements took place. We added 2 additional meeting rooms and soundproofed the ceilings in all 3 lower rooms.

Security Cameras

We upgraded our security camera system for our building.

Ice Edger

We purchased a Zamboni for our rinks. Don't get excited, it is just an edger not a ride on.

Woodlands rink fence

Many of our hockey players can't hit the net when they shoot, but they sure can it the side of the garage. We installed a chain link fence on the north side of the rink.

Audio visual

With more meeting rooms downstairs we have added a portable projector and screen.

Outdoor Bulletin board

To better advertise our events and activities we now have an outside board on the west side of the building.

These additions are meant to improve our community facilities.

COMMUNITY ISSUES

Probably the most contentious issue this year was the BRT debate. This is on hold for the time being and hopefully the City will be reconsidering the entire issue. The biggest upcoming affect on the community will be the Tsuu Tina development west of Woodbine. This is planned as a commercial retail development. Watch the Chronicle and the papers for more news.

The ring road is finally underway and you will note the extension of 130th Ave. to the west. This will allow traffic to and from the north onto 130th Ave.

Community Membership

Our community support continues to grow. From 241 in 2010, we reached 1360 in 2016. As an aside we are now over 1050 for the current year and hope to surpass the 1500 mark. We continue to receive strong support from the senior group at 57.5% of our membership. Family at 38.4% and business 4.1%. Membership is equal between Woodbine & Woodlands.

Building Usage

One of the key areas we look at is how the Community Centre is being used. This past year we had 864 hours of community programs covering 402 bookings. This is an increase of 19% over the previous year. These are non profit groups and are community service.

For building rentals, we had 879 bookings covering 2117 hours. This is a decrease of 242 hours from the previous year. The majority of these hours were from main hall rental and resulted from two Boot Camp programs not continuing. One has since restarted.

As an update, we now have our two new meeting rooms in the lower level. For the months of September and October this year the Woodlands room had 29 bookings for 32 hours. The Woodbine room had 45 bookings for 98 hours. The new rooms are being well used and the decision to convert them from storage to meeting rooms is going to increase our Centre usage.

Closing Remarks

Since this is my last President's report, I want to acknowledge the great support I have had from my Board of Directors, and from the many volunteers who have stepped up to support the Community. It was a pleasure working with you.

I also want to thank the community centre operating staff of Linda, Lorraine and Al. They have kept the Centre running and improving over the years and have done a great job. Thanks for a job well done.

That basically covers what has happened in your community this past year.



WHAT IS WOODCREEK?

If you ask people in our area where they live, they say Woodlands or Woodbine. So where does Woodcreek come from? A little history lesson will give you the answer.

Woodlands was established in 1976 and Woodbine 4 years later in 1980. The Woodlands Community Association was incorporated on May 21, 1980, and two years later the Woodbine Community Association was registered on October 19, 1982. In order to better serve the needs of the area, the Woodlands and Woodbine Communities amalgamated on January 29, 1992 and the Community Association name was changed to Woodcreek Community Association and represents the 15,399 residents of both communities. In 1987 a Community Centre building (approximately 1000 sq. Ft.) was built at 1991 Woodview Drive S. W. In 2010 we added a 2500 sq. ft. addition with a full basement. We now have a facility that can better serve the needs of the community and provide a venue for meetings, banquets, dances, birthday parties, you name it. A portion of the basement area provides storage for our community groups.

So when you hear the name WOODCREEK think both of the communities.

A further point is that Woodcreek does have two properties. Our main location is the Community Centre in Woodlands. We also have a Woodbine location on Woodborough Road where we have tennis courts, pickle ball courts, basketball hoop, skating rink, a skate board park and a full basketball court. These are all part of the Woodcreek Community Association.



Yes, there is still a Santa Claus

It was about three in the afternoon when I received the call. It was Andy, our maintenance manager at Hull Services—a Calgary-based charity dedicated to helping kids (and their families) who face behavioural and mental health challenges—where we work.

"Our Santa Claus for the kids' party tonight has cancelled out." With a hint of suspicion in my voice, I asked, "Andy, what's your backup plan?" Not one to mince words, he replied flatly, "You are". Looking for one last way out, I said, "And if I can't do it, what's your plan?" Unflustered, Andy made it clear, "There isn't one." Apparently, the conversation had come to an end. I was it. "OK, I'll see you at six. Leave the suit in my office."

I had mixed feelings about my delegation. It was a nice job, but you need to be in the right mood ... overflowing with cheer and spirited laughter. I was concerned that I wasn't and the kids would know it. It was too late to worry about that. Maybe the suit would work some magic on me. I began to unpack it from the bag. Soon Andy showed up, "Come on! They're expecting us in 15 minutes!" "Relax," I said, "I only found out about this two hours ago! And besides I don't have any stuffing. Go get a pillow from one of the residences. "Oh geez," he said, disappearing into the night. When he returned, I stuffed the pillow under the red coat, and strapped it all together with a wide black belt. Just the finishing touches now: beard, wig, and hat. But the beard wouldn't stay up. The moustache was down around my lips. "Here," Andy said, "I'll staple it to your head. Who cares?! We gotta go. C'mon!"

Ready or not, it was showtime. About to leave my office, I realized we had forgotten something, "Andy, the bells! Go get the bells, they're in the washroom." A moment later Andy was running back down the hallway with bells ringing. Before you could say, Ho, Ho, Ho we were in his white pickup truck and off into the frigid, dark night.

We pulled up in front of one of the treatment residences and Andy told me to wait while he made sure everything was ready inside. Soon he reappeared and we went in. We asked some of the staff to do a visual check on Santa. After a few vain attempts to secure the floppy beard, we crossed our fingers and proceeded into the main area.

These kids here have not had it easy in life. That's a gross understatement. For one reason or another, they've been dealt a bad hand, whether it's from abuse or the result of a disorder of some kind. Day-to-day life can be a real struggle, both for the kids and the staff.

As I entered the room full of children, families, and staff there was a moment of quiet expectation. I shook the handbells and the room erupted in frantic delight. The children rushed Santa, grabbing and hugging every available part of me. Staff pulled kids off of me and I was able to make it to my designated chair where I could dispense presents. "Stephanie", I called, and a child would come forth, rushing me, squeezing me, mashing my glasses into my face. Over and over, this was repeated, each child having their special call, when they would come and sit with Santa, look into his face, and receive their gift. Some of the older teens pretended to be too cool, but most sat on Santa's knee, anyway. An autistic child came forward guided by a staff. He approached, and then withdrew. For the briefest of moments he turned and we connected, sharing our space.

One little girl sat upon my knee, looked seriously into my eyes, and slowly asked of me, "Are you the real Santa Claus?" After a moment of wondering about the correct thing to say my heart spoke out, "Yes, I'm the real Santa Claus." Satisfied with my answer the child waited no longer. She reached around my neck and embraced me with all of her strength, and I felt every bit of her belief in the spirit of Christmas. Then I realized what

this evening was all about. Here were these children, so potentially beaten down by life, but reminding us that the spark is alive within them and they will not allow it to be put out. They still have hope. It is to the anonymous Santa Claus that it is safe for them to reach out. In him there is giving, receiving and joy. That's what this whole opening up to the red-suited stranger was all about. After the hug the little girl again focussed on my face and assured me, confidently, quietly, "You're the greatest man in the world." Then she was gone into the crowd.

Before long, the piles of neatly wrapped presents had bloomed into acres of chaos and paper and the laughter of children. It was time to slip out. In the cold night I was warmed, not only by the suit, but by the joy the kids had given me. Back and forth, the discovery of Christmas shone between us all that night.

Back in my office I changed into my street clothes, asking Andy, "So, where do I put the Santa suit?" In his matter of fact manner he told me, "Just hang it up and I'll get it in the morning. We'll need it again next year."

Woodmont Crescent Angle Parking

Back in October, a small area in Woodbine was the centre of a parking issue that has had neighbours up in arms. On October 6th residents of Woodmont Crescent were ticketed by Calgary Parking Authority (CPA) for angle parking in the cul-de-sac whereas bylaw states only parallel parking is allowed.

While many residents have been angle parking to accommodate the large amount of vehicles in the area, CPA was forced to uphold the bylaw when an area resident made a formal complaint again the practice.

While it was an unfortunate incident, my staff and I, along with Dominic Barbario and Jim Lebedeff of CPA, visited the site to determine the next steps for residents. CPA suggested residents go through the proper channels to have the area specifically marked to allow for angle parking, as well as parallel parking at the bottlenecks of the cul-de-sac. By speaking with area residents and hearing their concerns, we were able to take a step forward in ensuring that this issue will not be an issue for these residents in the future.


