



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



www.did we have an interesting Annual General Meeting for the Woodcreek Community Association in late November. The AGM is meant to provide a recap of what has happened in the community during the past year and to

elect a new Board of Directors. For the first time I can recall, we actually had an election. There were two nominations for President and two for 2nd Vice President. Since both Darlynn Linn and I had both served more than two terms in our current position, the bylaws dictate that we must achieve a two thirds majority of the votes to be re-elected. We came close but did not receive the required numbers out of 35 votes cast; however the opposing candidates did not receive the required majority to be elected.

We were opposed by two candidates who were nominated by representatives of the Bulldogs football organization, an out of community organization that has rented storage space from us since 2010.

In February of 2015 we gave the Bulldogs notice that we would not renew their rental agreement after April 30, 2016. That is 15 months' notice. With the growth of activities at the community centre we need more meeting and activity space for programs, as well as an opportunity to increase our rental revenue to bring our community operations to a break-even point. We are converting the storage space to a meeting room for the benefit of the entire community. Hence the opposition from the Bulldogs.

This termination of the Bulldogs rental agreement and the subsequent election has now evolved into lawyers, letters to the premier, mayor, and other elected officials and even newspaper articles. So we will hold another election on January 26 for the two positions in question. The remainder of the executive and directors are elected and in place.


So, I would encourage all Woodcreek Community Association members to come out to the Special Membership Meeting as per the article and notice in the Chronicle and vote your choice. The basic question is: has the duly elected Woodcreek Community Association Board of Directors managed the community centre and properties in the best interest of the community as a whole. The opposing nominees may change, but I think that is still the major point of decision.

This is an important vote and it is up to you to decide what the future is for the Woodcreek Community Association. Please come out to the meeting and cast your vote.

In accordance with the WCA bylaws, voting is restricted to:

- "Family" memberships
- (1 vote/family, 18 or older, Woodcreek resident) • "Senior" memberships
- (1 vote/membership, Woodcreek resident)
- I. "Non-resident" members cannot vote II. No other memberships can vote

Voting memberships must be renewed by December 27, 2015 to vote.

Can't make it?

Only voting members can bring one (1) proxy for another, eligible voting member.

- A non-voting member cannot bring someone else's proxy vote.
- After you sign in at the entrance, you must show your proxy vote to our Secretary before the meeting begins.
- Candidates do not have to be at the meeting to run, but consent is then needed in writing.

We will be calling for nominations of eligible members from the floor. Important bylaws to note:

- "Any member in good standing may nominate any other member in good standing for election to the Board." -Article 4 Section 2
- "The Executive (except for the Past President) shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting by a simple majority of the members present..." - Article 4 Section 3
- "No member of the executive may hold the same executive position for more than two consecutive terms except by two-thirds of the votes cast." - Article 4 Section 3

If a position has <u>no</u> candidates elected, we will attempt a re-vote up to three (3) times. <u>If we are not successful</u> <u>electing to a position the board will move forward and</u> the position will be declared vacant. In accordance with the WCA bylaws these positions will not be elected until the next Annual General Meeting (AGM) or Special General Meeting (SGM). In the meantime, the board may appoint eligible members to fill vacancies until the next AGM or SGM elections (Woodcreek CA bylaws - Article IV Section 10).



WHAT IS **WOODCREEK?**

If you ask people in our area where they live, they say Woodlands or Woodbine. So where does Woodcreek come from? A little history lesson will give you the answer.


Woodlands was established in 1976 and Woodbine 4 years later in 1980. The Woodlands Community Association was incorporated on May 21, 1980, and two years later the Woodbine Community Association was registered on October 19, 1982. In order to better serve the needs of the area, the Woodlands and Woodbine Communities amalgamated on January 29, 1992 and the Community Association name was changed to Woodcreek Community Association and represents the 15,399 residents of both communities. In 1987 a Community Centre building (approximately 1000 sg. Ft.) was built at 1991 Woodview Drive S. W. In 2010 we added a 2500 sq. ft. addition with a full basement. We now have a facility that can better serve the needs of the community and provide a venue for meetings, banquets, dances, birthday parties, you name it. A portion of the basement area provides storage for our community groups.

So when you hear the name WOODCREEK think both of the communities.

A further point is that Woodcreek does have two properties. Our main location is the Community Centre in Woodlands. We also have a Woodbine location on Woodborough Road where we have tennis courts, pickle ball courts, basketball hoop, skating rink, a skate board park and a full basketball court. These are all part of the Woodcreek Community Association.

One further organization we have in the community is the Fish Creek Sports Association. They organize all of the Woodcreek sporting activities. When you buy a Woodcreek Community Association membership you also become a member of Fish Creek Sports.

EMS: Sledding Safety

Alberta Health Services, EMS, would like to remind parents and children of some basic sledding safety tips as the winter season continues. Sledding injuries can result from collisions with stationary objects, such as trees and rocks, or with other people on the hill. Unprotected falls can result in injury if you lose control at high speeds. Everyone is at risk – especially children. Have a fun and safe trip on the toboggan hill by following these simple reminders.

Equipment

- Ensure your sled is in good condition. Do not use sleds with broken parts, sharp edges, or splits in the material.
- Currently, there are no helmets designed specifically for sledding. However children should wear a properly fitted helmet designed for high impact collisions, such as hockey, cycling, or climbing helmets.

Hazards

- Avoid hills that are too steep, or too icy you can lose control very quickly.
- Choose hills free of obstacles such as trees, rocks, utility poles, or fences.
- Be mindful of clothing that contains drawstrings, or loose clothing, such as scarves, which can present a choking hazard if they become caught or snagged.

Plan ahead

- Dress warmly in layers and anticipate weather changes.
- Consider bringing extra sets of gloves and toques to exchange wet garments for dry ones.
- Take breaks to warm up out of the cold.
- Ensure frostbite hasn't affected any exposed skin.
- Even when properly protected from the elements, the finger tips, toes, ears, the tip of the nose, and other high points on the face such as the forehead and cheek bones can be affected by frostbite.
- If frost bite has occurred, treat it by first removing the individual out of the cold environment. Gently warm the affected skin by placing a warm hand over it or by placing the affected part in warm water (not hot; ~41°C max.) until re-warmed.

Pet Safety—Keep Your Pets Indoors This Winter

Humans are not the only ones who need to keep warm during the winter months. Your pets do too. Although they might be covered in fur, your pet can still fall ill during the colder months or even get frostbite when temperatures drop below freezing. But have no fear, here are a few tips on how to keep your pet warm this winter.

Keep your pet indoors. This is the number one way to keep your pets safe and warm in the winter. For dogs, take shorter walks when the weather is severely cold. A good rule of thumb is to go out with them and when you're ready to come in, chances are your dog is too. If your dog must stay outside, make sure she has proper shelter and a source of fresh water at all times, and make sure her water cannot freeze. It's important to remember that cold cars can pose a significant risk to your pet's health. Leaving your cat or dog in the car is just as dangerous in winter as in the summer. Limit car travel to only that which is necessary, and don't leave your pet unattended in the vehicle.

If you lose your pet during the winter months, do not delay. Call 3-1-1 to see if Animal Services has picked up your pet. If not, file a lost pet report with Animal Services.



CHANGES TO 14TH STREET & GLENMORE TRAIL WILL IMPACT YOU

The City of Calgary is trying to move forward quickly with the SW Transitway and Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project. 
