



# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



To say that October was both an exciting and busy month, I think would be an understatement. We began the month with the Oktoberfest dance, a continuation of our Speaker Series, and concluded with the WCA Annual Spook-tacular Kid's Halloween Party. All were

great events, but I think it's safe to say the star of the month was the Ward 13 political forum, which packed the hall, including standing room along the walls and down the en-

It all started about two weeks prior to the election with inquiries from our community members asking where they could attend a Ward 13 Councillor candidate O & A forum - residents had questions and they wanted answers! With a little research we discovered there was no forum being hosted in our ward. Given that our members were clearly looking for a Q & A forum, and despite the election being 15 days away and only one viable hall availability date, we reached out to the candidates with a last-minute invite to an event for which we did not have a developed agenda, format or any details beyond date and time. To their credit, all accepted, despite not knowing what they were going to walk into at the time!

The result of the Ward 13 forum was impressive. We estimate about 240 people came out to hear from all seven candidates. The forum consisted of a five-minute introduction by each candidate, followed by a series of questions. A 50/50 type draw system was used to select individuals, who then had 30 seconds to pose their question to the candidate panel. Each candidate had one minute to respond. After about an hour of Q & A, each candidate had two minutes for closing remarks. The event concluded with a meet-n-greet.

The entire event ran smoothly and on time, in part to our board member and moderator, Robin Parsons, who also designed the agenda and format for the evening, and a number of volunteers who made the event possible, but mostly as a result of those in attendance. In the past the hall has witnessed a few heated meetings and, given the subject matter, this forum could have been another one of those meetings, but it was not - everyone was polite, civil, and respectful. This meeting truly exemplified what one would expect from the democratic process. For that I thank everyone for taking the time to attend and, in doing so, for being an active participant in the electoral process.

On behalf of the Woodcreek Community Association, I thank all candidates for taking the time to run for public office. Today is Tuesday morning, the election results are known, and I offer congratulations to Councillor Diane Colley-Urguhart.





# WHAT IS **WOODCREEK?**

If you ask people in our area where they live, they say Woodlands or Woodbine. So where does Woodcreek come from? A little history lesson will give you the answer.

Woodlands was established in 1976 and Woodbine 4 years later in 1980. The Woodlands Community Association was incorporated on May 21, 1980, and two years later the Woodbine Community Association was registered on October 19, 1982. In order to better serve the needs of the area, the Woodlands and Woodbine Communities amalgamated on January 29, 1992 and the Community Association name was changed to Woodcreek Community Association and represents the 15,399 residents of both communities. In 1987 a Community Centre building (approximately 1000 sq. Ft.) was built at 1991 Woodview Drive S. W. In 2010 we added a 2500 sq. ft. addition with a full basement. We now have a facility that can better serve the needs of the community and provide a venue for meetings, banquets, dances, birthday parties, you name it. A portion of the basement area provides storage for our community groups.

So when you hear the name WOODCREEK think both of the communities.

A further point is that Woodcreek does have two properties. Our main location is the Community Centre in Woodlands. We also have a Woodbine location on Woodborough Road where we have tennis courts, pickle ball courts, basketball hoop, skating rink, a skate board park and a full basketball court. These are all part of the Woodcreek Community Association.



The City of Calgary is looking to citizens to help solve a littering issue: extinguishing cigarette waste. Smoker or non-smoker, you've likely witnessed someone flicking a cigarette butt on city streets (yes, that is a littering offense). While we have many systems in place to manage waste effectively, the solution begins with citizen responsibility when it comes to littering.

#### Proper disposal of cigarette waste at home:

- 1. Extinguished cigarette butts should be thrown away in the black cart.
- 2. Cigarette ashes need to be double bagged, tied closed and thrown away in the black cart.
- 3. Never flush cigarette butts or cigarette ashes down your toilet, sink or drain, as they are harmful to the environment and may cause damage to the pipes in your home.

4. Cardboard cigarette packaging goes in the blue bin for

As a safety protocol, the Calgary Fire Department encourages citizens to ensure that smokers in your home douse cigarette butts and ashes with water before placing them into a non-combustible container and to not ash out or dispose of cigarette butts in planters, mulch or flower beds. The components of soil include organic material that can smolder for hours before igniting.

The city centre is populated with cigarette butt receptacles for citizens to utilize while in public. Many communities and businesses self-manage receptacles for proper waste disposal or recycling purposes.

We want to maintain the standard of cleanliness and safety we work toward collectively. Help us maintain a #buttfreeYYC.

They all caught several fish and were able to bring them back to camp and cooked a delicious meal! For many this was the highlight of the week! We also had a pizza night provided by the camp support staff.

It was a busy week with around 7,000 people on site including all the volunteers who made everything happen and thanks to one of our Venturers for offering his time as a Lifeguard all week keeping all the swimming and water activities safe! 



# **Glenmore Dam Upgrades**


The Glenmore Dam has been key part of Calgary's water infrastructure system since the early 1930s. The wear and tear the dam has experienced over 85 years of service, and the ever-increasing demands of a growing city, mean the time has come for an extensive upgrade. These improvements will not only extend the life of the dam, but will help manage our drinking water supply and give us the ability to better control low and high river flows.

The first phase of the Glenmore Dam Infrastructure Improvements Program was the Utilities Relocation Project. This project involved moving the water and gas utility lines currently running across the top of the dam to a new tunnel excavated underneath the Elbow River. This is needed to allow access to the dam while upgrades are being made, which include a new bridge deck with better access for maintenance and pathway users, concrete work on the face of the dam, and a new steel gate and hoist system.

While the normal maximum operating levels of the reservoir remains the same, the new gate system will provide greater flexibility to manage reservoir storage during low flows in the winter and high flows in the spring.

The pathway across the dam was closed to the public on September 30, 2017, and then until the work is complete in 2020. Pathway detours will be implemented during this time and signage will be available to assist pathway users. (Up to date information on pathway closures, including maps, is available at calgary.ca/pathwayclosures.)

## **Albertan Students and the Opioid Crisis:**

People across the province tell me that it is crucial for age-appropriate information be taught about the opioid overdose crisis in the Alberta curriculum. A recent story from BC examined what resources are available within schools to teach students about their crisis; but there was no information on Alberta—which underlined the need for a comprehensive strategy to teach students the dangers of opioids—at age appropriate levels. As a United Conservative Advocate for Education, Post-Secondary Education, Indigenous Relations, and Wellness, I fully support immediately investigating the implementation of curriculum on the drug crisis. My colleagues and I believe our school system must be a safe space for students to learn about the dangers of the opioid crisis that Alberta continues to grapple with. If providing information within the school setting on the dangers of fentanyl can save even one life, it's worth it. Our caucus proposes that the government collaborate with health, education, and law enforcement professionals—along with other provinces to develop modules on the opioid epidemic, while ensuring harm-reduction, prevention, and awareness initiatives are taught. The more information students are equipped with, the more likely they are to understand the lethal nature of fentanyl and other opioids. It's a life and death issue.

#### **Connections with Alberta Families:**

Constituents continue to tell me that as Alberta families went back to school this fall, the disconnect between government policies and the harmful effect on students and parents is becoming more and more apparent. Worried parents have been left grappling with the consequences of Bill 1—with families bracing for far-away bus stops, terrible commutes, and uncertainty around programs of choice. Many students are dealing with the consequences of government policy—with some travelling on half-a-dozen different busses a day—just to get to and from school. When Bill 1 was introduced in the Legislature this spring, I warned government about the impact it would have on families every day. Coupled with the extra carbon tax costs, many families are in difficult situations. Our caucus continues to hear loud and clear from Albertan families who say they are worse off under these policies; and that if the government was listening, they would stop introducing policies that are hurting students and their families.
